**Storm Toll Is 57,
Europe Is Blasted**

LONDON (AP)—Winter storms raging in the Atlantic and across Europe Monday have killed an estimated 57 persons and left a path of havoc from Britain to Greece. The fury of stormy seas claimed most of the victims.

Four small ships were reported sunk. Others radioed for help as waves battered them. Scores ran for sheltered harbors. Across the entire Continent it was bitterly cold. Europe was awash with floods, buffeted by gales, buried beneath snow drifts. Off Britain's eastern shores, 14 men were drowned in the splintered wrecks of two little ships sunk by the storm.

**Greek Action
Is Protested**

LONDON (AP)—The British government Monday faced a surge of protest over Egyptian proposals to make a national shrine of a house where a young British army officer died during the 1956 Suez operation. Some MPs were reported plan-

ning to demand the Macmillan government break off newly restored diplomatic ties with the United Arab Republic unless President Nasser stops the project.

But Foreign Secretary Selwyn Lloyd, due to speak in the House of Commons today, is expected to resist the pressure, diplomatic sources said.

An Egyptian newspaper announced last week that a museum will be made of the house in Port Said where 20-year-old Lieut. Anthony Moorhouse died of asphyxiation after being kidnapped by Egyptians after the Suez cease-fire.

Diplomatic sources said Lloyd is convinced the Cairo government had no knowledge of the plan.

In Britain today popular feeling against the Egyptian move mounted.

"OUTRAGEOUS INSULT"

Said Conservative MP Edward Gardner:

"The Moorhouse museum is an outrageous insult to the memory of a gallant soldier and to his parents."

"If there is any suggestion that it should be set up seriously as a museum one would wonder seriously if there would be any profit in diplomatic relations with Egypt."

GIRL FOR CHAPLINS

LAUSANNE, Switzerland (Reuters)—Oona Chaplin, 34-year-old wife of 70-year-old actor-producer Charlie Chaplin, had an eight-pound girl here Thursday, her seventh child. Oona, daughter of playwright Eugene O'Neill, was reported doing well. The comedian and Oona now have five girls and two boys.

**Rat Scourge
Hits Hamlet**

GUATEMALA CITY, Guatemala (AP)—A scourge of rats, evidently hundreds of thousands of them, is plaguing the hamlet of Sansare in eastern Guatemala. The people there are desperate.

Entire crops of rice, beans and vegetables have disappeared. The rats have been increasing steadily in number during the last three weeks.

Some of the inhabitants complain that it is next to impossible to sleep.

"They come at sunset and disappear at dawn," Mrs. Carmen R. de Zacarias, owner of one of the best stores in the little city, explained.

"I find them comfortably asleep in the drawers of my desk," says Mayor Daniel Rios Hernandez. "The worst part is that all attempts to exterminate them seem fruitless."

"Traps are useless, poison they ignore and what is worse—all our cats are dead, to the last one! The fumigation killed all the fleas and cockroaches, the cats ate these last and died."

Eggs are a luxury in this town that once had a thriving poultry industry. The rodents seem to know just when an egg is to be laid.

**Water Pollution
Action Awaited**

HULL, Que., (CP)—Dr. Camille Pouliot, Quebec's minister of game and fisheries, said Saturday the province plans to take up the problem of water pollution "very soon."

He spoke at the closing dinner of the 14th annual meeting of the Quebec Federation of Fish and Game Associations.

Dr. Pouliot did not elaborate. When the Quebec legislature opened in November a bill concerning water pollution was listed. Its details were not known.

In 1956 a committee formed to study water pollution in the province recommended that a permanent organization be set up to prepare a concrete plan of action to solve the problem.

Dr. Pouliot said the government was highly interested in everything that affected hunting and fishing, which resulted in millions of dollars of revenue annually for Quebec.

About 250 delegates attended the three-day meeting.
