Many Forecasts On Outcome Of Kentucky Derby

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP)—Although forecasts on the outcome of the 80th Kentucky Derby flowed as freely as mint juleps Thursday, one of the opinions expressed most frequently by many so-called experts was that America's greatest horse race would be a duel between Correlation and Goyamo.

With Saturday's mile and one quarter dash for about \$100,000 drawing nearer hourly, no one could even say how many three-year-olds will face the starter and guesses ranged anywhere from 17 to 20.

There haven't been so many questions about a derby since Count Turf rambled home ahead of 10 others in 1941 at 15 to 1.

However, Robert S. Lytle's Correlation will be ridden by the brilliant Willie Shoemaker and the Woodvale Farm's Goyamo has none other than the great Eddie Arcaro to do the saddle honors.

There is no doubt the finest young jockey in the country today, while old battle-scarred banana nose Arcaro, as derby wise as they come, will be out for the ride of his life.

BOTH IMPRESSIVE
In a previous meeting this year between the two colts, Correlation and Shoemaker caught Goyamo and Arcaro in the stretch to win the Florida Derby March 20. Then the horses took different paths to the finish.

Correlation went to New York, and beat the favored Fisherman from the C. V. Whitney stable last Saturday. Correlation came from behind to win the Wood, which is a mile and one-eighth—same as the Blue Grass.

Correlation still rules the 5-2 favorite. Goyamo is rated at 7-2. The usual crowd of some 100,000 also will give plenty of support to the derby trial Tuesday, and broke the track record with a sparkling 1:35 for the mile. The previous record of 1:35.25 was set by Hill Gail in the 1932 derby trial.

Worsley Injured, In Crucial Series

CALGARY, (CP)—Vancouver Canucks, victims of a double setback, now are the underdogs to represent the Western Hockey League in the inaugural of a post-season series against the Quebec League champions.

The first blow was when Calgary Stampeders came from behind Wednesday night to edge Canucks 4-3 and deadlock the best-of-seven playoff final at two wins apiece.

But probably the harder blow was the loss of goalie Lorne (Gump) Worsley, who suffered a severely bruised back and torn ligaments in a third-period collision with Gus Kyle, burley Calgary rearguard.

Club officials said Thursday that Worsley, chosen league all-star netminder this year, is "through for the season." Canuck owner Colley Hall said Lucien Dechene will be in goal in the fifth game tonight to determine an opponent for Quebec Aces in the Duke of Edinburgh series.

Dechene, the "fat man" who played for New Westminster Royals this season, replaced Worsley Wednesday night when Worsley was unable to finish the game.

Blames O.H.A. For Finals Delay
EDMONTON, (CP) — Manager Leo Le Clerc of Edmonton Oil Kings, Western Canada junior hockey champions, Thursday blamed the Ontario Hockey Association for the delay in the Eastern Canada junior final.

"The eastern final was to have been over in time for the memorial cup final to be started by April 26 or 27, according to the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association," he said. But only two games of the best-of-seven eastern final between Quebec Frontenacs and St. Catharines Teepees, OHA titlist, have been played so far.

Oil Kings saw their last action a week ago when they eliminated Port William Canadiens for the western championship.

"The OHA perennially ignores CAHA playoff deadline dates," Le Clerc said. "If the west did the same chaos would result."

"If one hockey league won't abide by the rules, the CAHA should reduce the current eastern final."

The Oil Kings already have carried their protest to J. Harper Farry, secretary-manager of the WJHL, and he has relayed it to the Alberta branch of the CAHA.
