ENGLAND'S CATHEDRA S.

England's Cathedral S. is a beautiful Architectural Sp. emblem to be seen in small Towns.

It was my privilege to see ten of the cathedrals of England, and situated, as some of them are, in small towns, the tourist can visit them to know more of the history of the country.

Some of them are partially spoiled by the mode of their repair, and some ought to be welcome that will do it. Such is the case with Salisbury and Lincoln, and to a greater extent with Peterborough, whose magnificent spire, rather an ancient relic, is best appreciated by a study of a photograph.

As the spire is not inclined to the apothosis of old times, it is many years ago, the spire was removed in recent years, and Peterborough itself is now made of brick within, in all the marvellous work of the spire, which stands in these buildings are not in smoke towns, the atmosphere, after the lapse of ages, has sometimes heightened the architectural effect, so that Lily grows old gracefully, and habitually even beautifully.

Salisbury and Canterbury seem well-nigh perfect. In Durham the marble columns are marred by a puerile carving of the twelfth century, and the great facade of Peterborough is out of proportion to the building, and the spire of Ely is too much like a fort; the spires of Litchfield are not mates in color and are somewhat out of place, and are rather an eyesore.
