

# Bombers Capture Ch'ship In Down To Wire Finish

# Former Great Champ Observes 50th Birthday

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Former world heavyweight champion Joe Louis reaches another milestone in one of sports' most remarkable careers Wednesday — his 50th birthday.

And in the typical, simplified philosophy of Joe Louis, he views the matter this way: "My mind tells me I'll be 50, but my legs say I might be older."

No, the Brown Bomber isn't ready for the wheelchair, but he admits on a golf course he does enjoy an electric cart.

Louis makes his headquarters

in Los Angeles now but he's likely to show up most anywhere in the country. And if he doesn't have his golf bag in tow, he'll know where to locate one, as well as the nearest course.

GOLF A PASSION  
Golf has been Joe's main passion for years, and too often in the company of golf sharpshooters, his biggest weakness.

Over the years Joe hasn't changed much. He emerged without a scar from his 71 bouts in which he bled 34 opponents and outlasted 13 others by decision.

"I weigh 260 now. My last fight,

with Rock Marciano, I weighed 274. I got to step up on my diet. I'd like to weigh around 235. No more."

Joe said he has several things going for him now, including a connection with a New York real estate firm. He earned a 1 m o s t 4,000,000 in purses, plus more out of the public relations firm.

Where it all went no one really knows. But in 1960 an internal revenue service aide said the government, while not officially closing the books, had abandoned any hope of getting more tax money from the ex-champion.

Louis originally owed \$345,000 in taxes on his earnings. Interest had brought the amount to more than \$1,250,000 by 1960.

Money was for living, Louis seemed to figure, and with the help of many friends, Joe lived when he could afford it. Today he and his third wife, Martha, a Los Angeles lawyer, seem comfortably, if not sumptuously, fixed.

Joe has candid opinions of today's fighters compared with some of the men he met and whipped.
