Current Notes.

The question, "How long is it necessary to keep children away from school after an infectious disease?" was answered some time since by the Academy of Medicine, Paris. With scarlet fever, diphtheria, measles, and small-pox, isolation is to be maintained for forty days. Chicken-pox and mumps lose their contagious power after twenty-five days.

Among the recent boiler curiosities, says the "Iron," was the discovery of a piece of plate covering a space of about six inches square, full of fine cracks. These cracks had evidently come from defect in the iron in the first instance, but the boiler had been run for two years at from eighty to ninety pounds pressure, and the boiler inspectors had just pronounced it perfectly safe for one hundred pounds.

A Virginian correspondent gives some interesting reminiscences of the Marquis of Lorne's family, suggested by that nobleman's visit to the States. Many years ago, he writes, two brothers, John and Andrew Glassell, came from Scotland to Virginia, and built in Madison county a stately brick house, still standing, called "Thorwald." Lord Campbell afterwards became Duke of Argyll, and was father of the present Duke and grand-father of the present Marquis of Lorne. Wm. E. Glassell, son of Andrew and first cousin of Joanna, is still living in Fauquier county, Virginia. Members of his family have visited Scotland and been kindly received and entertained by their kinsman, Argyll.
