Americans Smash Viet Cong Base

SAIGON (AP)—U.S. 1st Infantry Division troops uncovered a big rice cache northwest of this South Vietnamese capital Monday in a sweep that a spokesman said "has really torn up the base of operations" of the Viet Cong guerrillas' 9th division.

Operating 65 miles from here, the troops seized a 3 1/2-ton store of rice just north of where they found 358 tons Sunday.

A military spokesman also said the enemy had lost 945 dead since the operation, called Attleboro, began Oct. 15 in the long-time Viet Cong stronghold.

Far to the north, units of the U.S. 25th Infantry Division searched for about 500 North Vietnamese who mauled 175 Americans in a 90-minute battle Sunday near Cambodia's border.

U.S. B-52 bombers, in one of three raids, pounded suspected North Vietnamese concentrations facing the 25th in the front 200 miles north of here.

Bad weather restricted U.S. air strikes in North Viet Nam to 71 missions.

One of the B-52 raids was in support of Operation Attleboro. The other B-52 raid was on a storage area.

The U.S. spokesman said that in all Operation Attleboro has swept up 1,480 tons of rice badly needed by the Viet Cong. In addition, he said the Amer-

icans have seized cooking oil, fish, salt, weapons, ammunition and explosives.

In South Viet Nam, there were only small and sporadic skirmishes.

Decorations Are Opposed

OTTAWA (CP)—Defence Minister Hellyer told the Commons Monday he has asked a cereal company to co-operate in the matter of respect for military decorations.

He was replying to David Fulton (PC—Kamloops) who asked whether the government had taken any action over complaints that a breakfast food manufacturer was using such decorations as the Victoria Cross in promotional advertising.

Mr. Hellyer said he has written the company, which was not identified, asking for co-operation so that it would "not in any way diminish" honors won by Canadian servicemen, often at the cost of their lives.

Budget Bounty

With the food budget stretched about as far as it will go these days, dairy foods are more important than ever in the menu plan. What other group of foods can add such sparkle to everyday meals without sacrificing the down-to-earth nutrition everyone needs.

Perfect Mixer

Don't overlook cottage cheese for instance, it's a marvelous mixer. Toss it into all your salads for extra protein and learn to cook with it too! Scrambled eggs become a gay treat when you add cottage cheese to them for extra creaminess and a bit of chopped pimiento and green pepper for color. 1 cup cottage cheese is about right for six eggs along with 1/2 cup milk. Season to taste and scramble in lots of butter.

Macaroni Winner

Man's the week the budget has been saved with macaroni and cheese we're sure. By serving it in bright green pepper shells or fresh tomato cups, the family will think you're paying special attention to them instead of to the budget! Serve with wine or bolognese for Saturday night supper.

Casserole Cuisine

For a cottage casserole, mix 1 cup cottage cheese with an 8-ounce package freshly cooked wide noodles, 1/2 cup chopped green pepper, 1/2 cup chopped green onion and a 4-ounce can sliced mushrooms, drained. Season with salt, pepper and 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce then fold in 1 cup dairy sour cream. Turn into a 2-quart casserole and bake in a preheated 350°F oven 20 to 25 minutes. Presto, supper for four.

Toasty Treat

If you play your cards right there should be room in the budget for a treat or two. Cut unliced white bread into 3-inch fingers, dip in undiluted evaporated milk, brush with melted butter then roll in a mixture of 1/2 cup granulated sugar, and 2 tablespoons cinnamon. Place on a wire rack in a shallow baking pan and bake at 400°F about 20 minutes. The youngsters will love them with tall glasses of milk.
