THE CENSOR IS AT WORK AGAIN

IMPORTANT EVENTS IMPENDING AT THE FRONT.

Buller Said to be About to Advance

More Details of the Convoy Disaster—Fight Marked by Many Courageous Acts—Boers seem to be in Great Strength—Colonial Representation in British Parliament.

SPECIAL DESPATCH TO THE EXAMINER.

LONDON, April 4.—General Cronje and 1,000 prisoners have sailed for St. Helena.

The censorship has been re-imposed, and important events are believed to be impending at the front.

A great battle may be in progress. Mafeking was still besieged on March 20th.

General Buller is reported to be about to advance.

It transpires that there were no scouts ahead of Broadwood's captured convoy.

MORE ABOUT THE CONVOY CAPTURE.

LONDON, April 4.—The War Office has no information as to who commanded the Boers in the affair leading to the capture of the British guns; but it places no reliance whatever on the supposition that the United States attaché, or anyone connected with the United States Government, took any part in it.

The fight was marked by many acts of individual courage.

The first man to warn the British of an ambush was a sergeant of the army service corps, who shot a Boer dead with his revolver.

A Household Cavalry man, who was summoned to surrender, threw his rifle into his captor's face knocking him over and escaped.

According to the testimony of eyewitnesses, the Boers shot some of the prisoners and killed some of their own men who advanced to demand the British surrender.

But the confusion was so great, the fire proceeding from all directions and the Boers firing on the convoy in which their own men were mixed up, that it is impossible to say exactly what happened.

The enemy pursued the British for miles, killing, wounding and taking prisoners.

One squadron of Sixth Dragoons, which entered the action 140 strong, mustered at the end ten mounted men.

The Boers seem to be in great strength throughout the district and are signalling on all sides.

A large body is reported moving southwest of Bloemfontein, in the direction of the railway.

The British troops are in urgent need of reinforcements.

LONDON, April 4.—In the House of Commons yesterday, Mr. Heddernick, Liberal, moved that an open House was desirable in the interests of the Empire, that colonies should be admitted to some representation in Parliament. He said this movement was particularly popular in Canada.

Mr. Chamberlain said that if the object of the resolution was the union of the colonies with the Mother Country they could have no more strenuous supporter than himself.

Such a change, continued the Colonial Secretary, must come gradually with the full consent of the colonies.

No praise could be too high for the colonial patriotism. If any demand upon the Mother Country were made by the

colonies, nothing would be surer than a favorable reply of Parliament.

So far the colonies have not made any definite suggestion with respect to representation, and I am convinced that nothing would be more fatal than a premature discussion of details. We are not going to interfere in the domestic affairs of the colonies, nor are they going to interfere in ours.

The present resolution is premature, is necessarily academic and might be mischievous.

The resolution was then withdrawn.

QUEEN'S VISIT TO IRELAND.

An Impressive Demonstration in Dublin.

DUBLIN, April 4.—The premature arrival of the Queen and the wretched weather were a disappointment to the people of Kingsdown.

Nevertheless, as soon as the new spread, large numbers started for the harbor.

While the Duke of Connaught, commander of the forces in Ireland, and Earl Cadogan, Lord Lieutenant, also hurried there; and late in the afternoon boarded the Royal yacht where they were greeted by the Queen.

James Egan, the Dublin city sword-bearer who, for nine years, was imprisoned for political offences has refused to take part in tomorrow's proceedings. This declaration at the last hour has caused a sensation.

In a letter to the town clerk, Egan gives his reasons and states that he is prepared to accept the consequences in the shape of handing in his resignation.

The reception here promises to be a most impressive demonstration of Irish feeling.
