



**NEW SKIN-GRAFTING EQUIPMENT**

A new piece of equipment which has been donated to the Prince County Hospital by the Hospital Ladies' Aid is shown above being used by Dr. A. R. Grant, assisted by nurses, Mrs. James Cochrane and Miss Eleanor Gaudet. The apparatus is called a Stryker Electro-Dermatome and is used primarily for skin-grafting operations for severe burn cases and is a great improvement over the hand-operated instrument formerly in use. A whole group of additional surgical power instruments may be easily attached to it and driven by its motor. Its cost was \$500.

**Undersized Lobsters Brings Court Action**

ALBERTON — Gerald B. Gillis of Kildare Central, was fined \$150 and costs or 30 days in jail by Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald here yesterday afternoon for possession of 1,225 undersized lobsters.

A Tignish lobster dealer, Jerry Bute, pleaded guilty to possession of 495 undersized lobsters and 441 lobster bodies measuring less than two and a half inch carapace measure on June 11 and not guilty to possession of 273 illegal lobsters on June 30. All three cases were adjourned to July 11.

Joseph Clarence Hayward, Kildare Central, was fined \$50 and costs or 30 days for possession of 571 undersized lobsters and Melvin Joseph Chaisson received a similar fine for having possession of 243 short lobsters. Carl Ellsworth, Palmer Road, was fined \$20 and costs for possession of 40 illegal lobsters.
