U.S. Accused Of Preparing Gas Warfare

MOSCOW (Reuters) - The United States is accused by a Moscow newspaper of preparing to use gas warfare in South Viet Nam. The official trade union newspaper Trud also says new poison gases are being tried on American convicts facing death sentences. The militarists of the U.S.A. are working out plans for gas warfare against the South Vietnamese people, it says. Trud bases its assertion on the reported landing in South Viet Nam of what it describes as a mobile scientific research institute of the 406th U.S. Special Detachment for Chemical Warfare. The Trud article is the latest in a series of Soviet press commentaries taking an increasingly tough line toward the U.S.
