## Reviews Federal Election Campaign Issues In Kings

Following is the text of an address broadcast last evening by Mr. John A. Macdonald, Progressive Conservative candidate for King's:

This is the last of a series of broadcasts on behalf of the Progressive Conservative Association of King's County which has been in progress each day for the past two weeks. During that time, as an indication of the active interest that has been taken by people in all walks of life, we have had several farmers, fishermen, a merchant, a farmer's wife, a teacher, an ex-service woman, etc., speak on our behalf.
