Valedictory Is Given To P. W. C.

Today is a day in which all our thoughts are of the future. But before we leave Prince of Wales for the last time, let us stop for a few minutes and look not to where we are going, but where we have been, for it is our past which will acclaim our future. Miss Jean Isable MacDonaid said in her Valedictory address to Prince of Wales college Friday.

We are fortunate indeed to have been part of Prince of Wales. As graduates, we look to the future with hope and eagerness; but, as graduates, we cannot help but look back at the past with a feeling of sadness. No one is leaving here today without his own personal store of memories of his stay at Prince of Wales.

"Many of the memories that will always be with us are those of the social life we have enjoyed at College. These are important after all, no college would be complete without its social life. But it is much more important that we always remember the things we have been taught. The most necessary part of learning, someone once said, is to never unlearn what you have learned."

"We have been given a good education here," she said "and we must always make the best use of it. Whether or not we go on to other universities is of secondary importance. All the things we have done in College will have been done in vain if we forget them the minute we receive our diplomas."

"The value of college life depends on the individual. By making use of what college life has given us, we alone are able to determine its value. Then, what value shall we give it? A highly-

paid man with four or five degrees is no necessarily a well-educated man. Education, Einstein has said, is what remains after you've forgotten the facts.

To our teachers we owe a debt of gratitude that can never be repaid in full. Without their guidance we would not be here today. We have often complained when we were given exams and assignments, but we can see now that our teachers were always working for us. And now, just when we are beginning to appreciate what they have done for us we must leave them.

"But," she stated, "I think it is to our parents that we owe the most. They too have shown infinite patience and understanding. They have always stood by us with words of advice and encouragement. And although we have often disappointed them and let them down, we can only hope that we have not fallen too far short of their standards. Our parents have sacrificed more than we can ever realize to bring us to this day, and we hope that in seeing us here on the stage, they are gaining some reward for their labors. Our debt to them is so great that the only way we can repay them is to try, when our turn comes, to be equally unselfish in fulfilling our duties as parents."

"Fellow Graduates: Today we are leaving Prince of Wales, and we should feel humble at the fact that we are leaving so much behind and taking so little with us. But leave we must, and my one wish for you is that your years here have not been wasted."

"We have reached an important milestone on the road. This is where the road parts, and we must each choose for ourselves the way we will take. Some of us may go on together for a few more years at least; some of us may never meet again. But as

we stand at the fork in the road, I ask you to remember the words of the late King George VI; And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown." And he replied, "Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a the know way."

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F. R. McLaine Was Representative Chrysler Dealer

WINDSOR, Ont. The second phase in the steady development of the Chrysler of Canada dealer's advisory council began with a series of coast to coast meetings held during May.

The Moncton regional meeting was held May 22 and 23 and was composed of eight delegate dealers elected by all dealers in the region. They discussed factory-dealer matters with the corporation's regional representatives, the results of which will be brought up at the national meeting to be held in Windsor, June 18-20, inclusive.

Mr. F. R. McLaine, Chrysler-Plymouth-Fargo dealer from Charlottetown P.E.I., represented the dealers from this area at the meeting.

Similar regional meetings are

being held in Toronto, Montreal, Regina, Red Deer and Vancouver. Each regional meeting will elect a chairman and secretary to represent dealers at the national meeting. These 12 delegates to the national council will be headed up by Sam Bernardo of Brantford who was elected temporary chairman at the organizational meeting of the dealers' advisory council last March. Senior sales executives, from the corporation headed up by C.O. Hurly, vice-president in charge of sales, will join the dealer representatives at this national meeting.

"Dealers from coast to coast are showing great interest in the formation of this dealer's advisory council and everyone feels that it will be an extremely valuable sales tool," K.D. Heath, Chrysler of Canada's director of dealer relations states.

their delegations meet at the Rome headquarters of the United Nations Food and Agricultural Organization.

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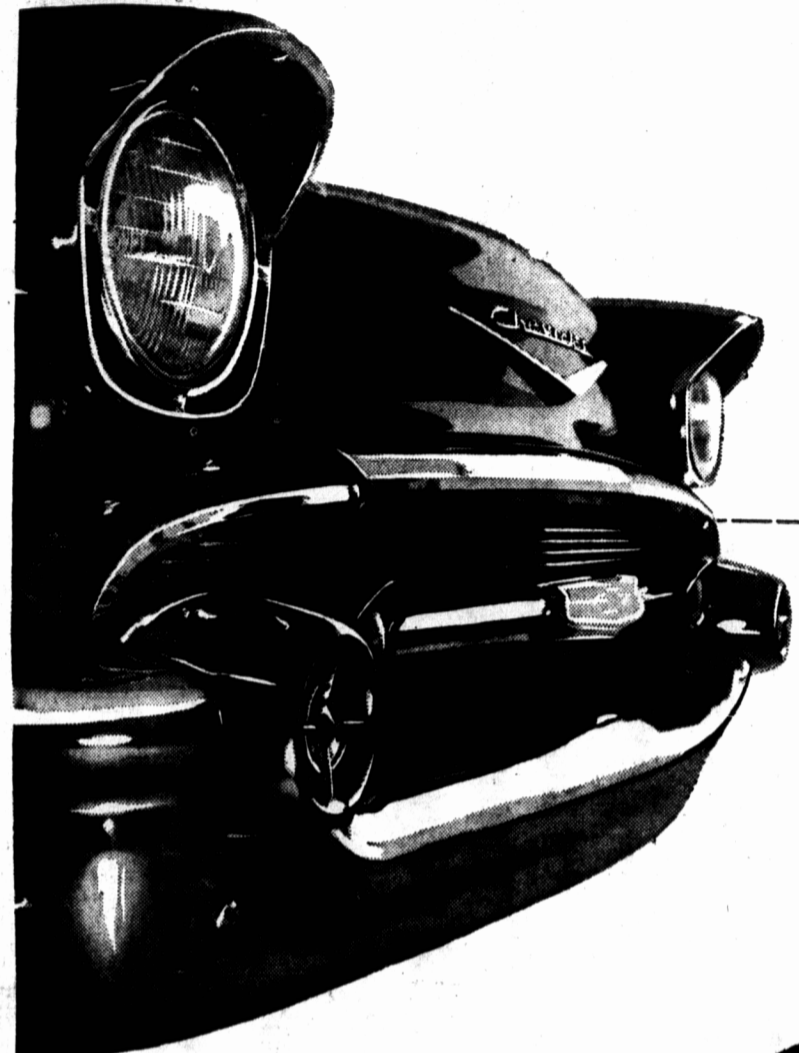
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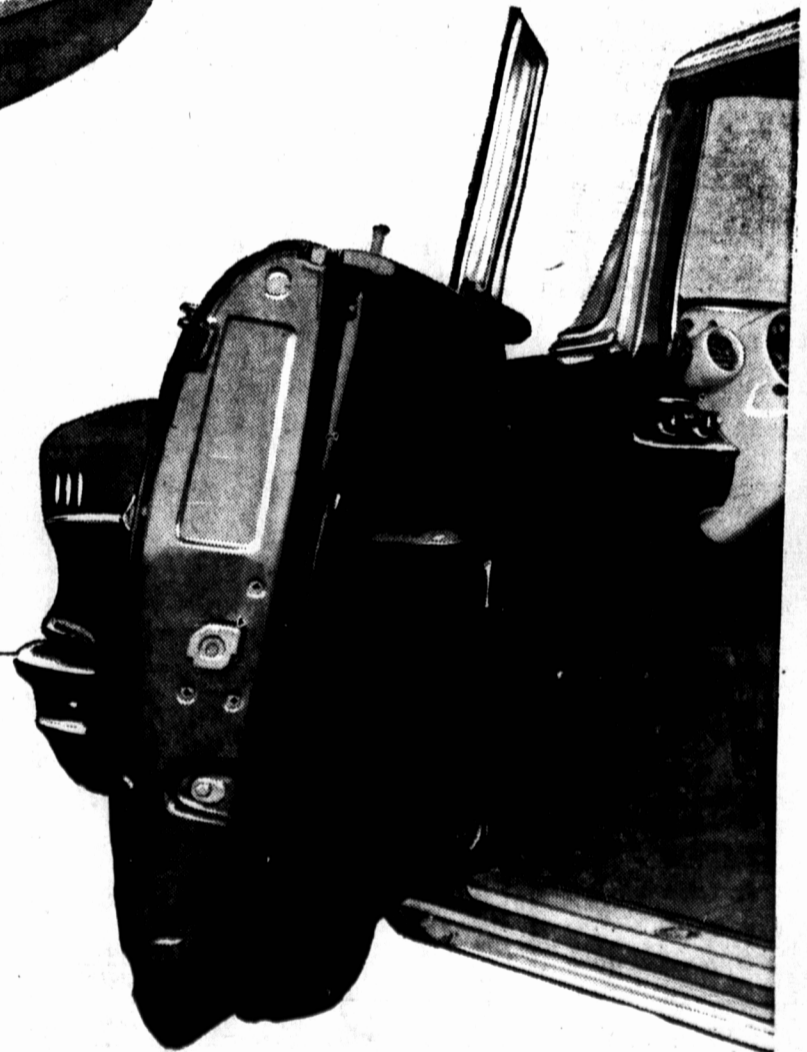
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
