

Life More Carefree In South Seas With Aircraft

AUCKLAND, N.Z. (CP)—Life in the South Sea islands of romance may not be as idyllic as in novels, but it is still pretty carefree by the standards of the modern world. Its not much effort to grow food or to catch it from the sea. Housing is little problem—the materials for a thatched hut grow in abundance. So life, love and laughter go on as always.

But always there have been darker moments. Illness, accidents, hurricanes find these isolated communities with few resources. That has been the case in the past anyway. Infrequent and slow communications have meant

people struck by disaster have struggled through or have died before help could come.

Now, however, the natives of the South Pacific have an ever-present help in time of trouble—a maid of all work which can render help at short notice. It is the flying boat squadron of the Royal New Zealand Air Force, stationed at Lautoka bay, Fiji.

DEFENCE NETWORK

The squadron is part of the free nations defence network in the Pacific. Equipped with long-range Sunderland flying boats, its task is reconnaissance and tracking down submarines and other enemies. Since 1953 it has been stationed in Fiji as part of New Zealand's effort to relieve Britain of some of her defence burden.

But the squadron operates widely outside this official defence sphere. The flying boats are ideal for linking islands with no airfields. They can land anywhere there is a smooth stretch of water—and this covers the large numbers of islands and atolls with a coral reef sheltering a lagoon near the shore.

Its tasks range from dropping supplies to castaways to helping pacify natives engaged in tribal wars. Recently a feud between two villages in the Lau group led to fist fights, then clashes with sticks and stones, and finally to a pitched battle in which a man was killed and others wounded. A Sunderland flying boat was hastily loaded up with police and officials and in a matter of hours peace was restored.
