Thoughts For Our Time

THE COMMANDMENT OF LOVE

The great commandment of love which our Lord repeated for the doctor of law who stood up to test Him, embraces every activity and every department of our lives. To love God with one's whole heart, one's whole soul, with all one's strength and mind, does not leave much unmentioned. Our divine Lord goes out of His way to be perfectly clear on how completely we must be devoted to the love of God. And the inference is that anything which cannot be seen as directed to God is of no value whatsoever. Indeed, anything which cannot find a place in the pattern of the love of God is not worth the doing, has no right to be done.

It is important to bear in mind that the love of God is not a case of feeling—it is a case of will. Modern attitudes to love tend to make us consider it something in the nature of a disease which one might catch if he is not careful. One hears the expression so often "falling in love," which implies a certain amount of unfortunate accident, rather than intelligent forethought. But the true love of God is not like this. It is more a case of recognizing God as the Supreme Good, and then tending to Him with all one's heart. It is in this, rather than in any transitory feeling, that the ecstasy of love consists.

Because of this and similar mistaken notions, about the love of God, many people are left cold by the idea. They have heard the phrase "love of God" and have had a certain faint desire, perhaps, to love Him. And yet because it seems so vague and distant, so nebulous and negative, they never bring themselves to enter into it to explore the treasures of their Father's house. There is something pathetic about all this, something tragic. For we were made to love God and find happiness in loving Him; and every desire for good or supposed good which comes into our heart is a desire for Him, whether we realize it or not.

An example of this, a story which has attracted mankind for centuries, is the life of St. Augustine. As a youth he was much taken up with the things of the world and pursued a life of sin. After he had turned to God and left his sinful desires which had torn at him were really the misdirected desire for God. As he says himself, he sought God outside himself, and all the time God was right within him. When he realized the true nature and object

of his love, then did he find peace and order in his life. From him come those beautiful and oft-quoted words "Thou hast made us for Thyself, O God, and there is no rest for our hearts until they come to rest in Thee."

How do we know we are loving God? Christ gave us the answer when He said "If you love Me, keep My commandments." To keep the law of God, to fulfill our duties to God and man, is most surely to love God. For each one of us there is a more or less clearly defined pattern or plan of duty, which we know we must perform. This for us is God's will, and in a very real sense, God's commandment for us. It is within this orbit of duty that our love of God is to develop and grow. And what difference does it make whether our deeds are great or small, so long as we do them for the love of God? Men may judge us insignificant, but God reads the heart. On the night before He died, Our Blessed Lord poured out His soul to His apostles in a love so tender and profound that we look in vain for similar pages among the writers of the world. And in this supreme moment of His life, as He broke bread among those He loved so well, He gave a command, a parting mandate, to these friends of His. "A new commandment I give you, that you love

one another as I have loved you," That was His dying wish, and remains His wish yet today. And He went on to point out to them that this love for one another would be the mark of His followers. "By this will all men know that you are My disciples, if you have love, one for another."

Let us suppose that a visitor from another planet were suddenly to appear in our midst. Do you think he would be able to single out the Christians from the other people by their love for one another? Would it be obvious, I wonder, who are the true followers of Christ? Or would the visitor be left in ignorance of the true love of one's fellowman, which is supposed to characterize the Christian? You know there are a hundred little opportunities which come
