Col. Andrew, extolling the possibilities of successful farming, described his brief experience as a salesman in Western Canada forty years ago and the satisfaction with which he returned to the island. On concluding his war service on the second time, Col. Andrew became interested in Ayrshires and in 1944 having disposed of his fox ranch he expanded his dairy farm holdings, concentrating on Ayrshires and cows. "I have never regretted the decision," he said.

Quoting figures for milk production Col. Andrew said that in 1956 the island production was 219,576,000 pounds and in 1955 it was 216,711,000 pounds. An increase of 2,865,000 pounds.

Precedent-Setting Decision By Canada Labor Relations Board

OTTAWA (CP)—In a precedent-setting decision, the Canada labor relations board has refused to grant bargaining certification to a union supported by a majority of seamen on Canadian-owned but British-registered vessels operating in Canadian waters.

half the Canadian scale. The crew members signed, on the four vessels as members of Britain's National Union of Seamen. During their 1956 operations in Canadian waters, the SIU signed up a substantial majority of them.

When the seamen signed on the vessels, the board said, it was intended they should be under British law. The board had found nothing in the Canadian labor code requiring it to exercise jurisdiction "where international law for reasons of comity would justify a refusal to do so."
