Miss Anne Tuplin left by train Monday morning for Montreal after spending a week with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Fred Tuplin, Indian River.

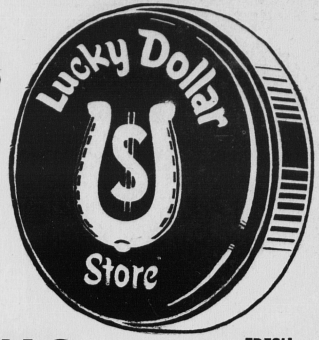
Mrs. Harry Wall and daughter Cathy returned to their home in Indian River, after spending a week in Saint John, N.B., visiting relatives.

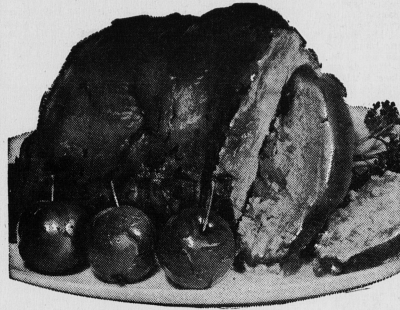
