Congo Independent 5 Years Begins Moving Into New Era

The Congo marks the fifth anniversary of its independence from Belgium...

By ARNOLD AMBER LEOPOLDVILLE (Reuters)—The Congo, burdened by five years of chaos and conflict...

As Congolese army forces led by white mercenaries stamp out the last pockets of the more than one-year-old rebellion...

This is essential for the young Africa's country, which celebrates its fifth anniversary of independence from Belgium...

One United Nations official sums up the situation this way: "Now, as hard information is being compiled on the vast number of administrators, teachers, politicians and thousands of other Congolese killed by the rebels in the northeast region..."

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Early Bird communications satellite went into commercial service Monday, and President Johnson made the first official spaceborne transatlantic telephone call.

A few minutes later the Duke of Windsor, at his home near Paris, unexpectedly became one of the first private individuals to communicate by way of the satellite when he accepted a call from a friend at the inaugural ceremonies here.

From London, Prime Minister Harold Wilson stirred laughter among the guests here with a jest, heard over a public address system in the hotel room where the ceremonies took place...

CONGRATULATES U.S.

But Swiss President Hansruedi Tschudi expressed his sentiments in English, and congratulated the people of the United States on the success of the satellite system.

President Johnson, unable to attend the inaugural function, spoke from the White House. "This moment marks a milestone in the history of communications—between peoples and nations," he said.

For the first time, a man-made satellite is being put into commercial service as a means of communications between continents. The occasion is as happy as it is historic. For about three hours Monday...

Congolese universities produced only a handful of graduates at independence in 1960 and there were only a few qualified administrators to run the government and industry.

The most difficult problem, apart from inefficiency in administration, there was corruption on national, provincial and local levels.

Also there was no sense of national unity when independence came. Fighting between tribes among the Congo's 15,000,000 people took a heavy toll of lives in the first years of independence.

Until 1967, all political activity was barred by the Belgians, but independence saw an extreme form of the democratic process: About 100 small tribal and regional parties had been formed.

When post-independence army mutinies shook the country, there was a need for strong and united political leadership. Instead the Congo became a three-way struggle between president Joseph Kasavubu, premier Patrice Lumumba and Moïse Tshombe of Katanga province and Albert Kalonga of South Kasai province.

Canadians Aid Congo Library

TORONTO (CP)—Library shelves labelled Canada in a university just outside of Leopoldville in the Congo were empty until students and staff at Ottawa and Laval universities started sending books.

This is just one example of the need for books in countries overseas. Daniel C. Spry, president of the Overseas Institute of Canada told delegates to the 20th annual conference of the Canadian Library Association here.

army commander Gen. Joseph Mobutu has repeatedly stressed that his forces must be retrained and provided with better equipment to maintain order.

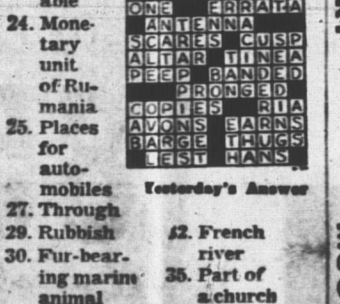
Both Lumumba and Cyrille Adoula, who became premier after the death of Lumumba, had to contend with makeshift conditions which repeatedly proved disloyal and unmanageable.

Since he took over the premiership in July, 1964, Tshombe has shown that he possesses rare political skill.

Besides making the necessary decisions to stop the rebellion, he has concluded important economic agreements with Belgium and other countries and has overcome some African animosity toward him policies in Katanga.

Until the Congo army can ensure complete security it is believed some mercenary units remain.

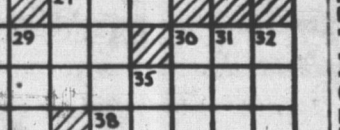
