U.S. Relief Trucks Captured By Viet Cong

SAIGON (AP)—Three trucks loaded with American food and medicine captured by Viet Cong guerrillas in February were halted at roadblocks set up by Communist Viet Cong guerrillas.

Ordered out at support, the trucks carried supplies of cans of vegetable oil, tins of milk and bags of wheat carried off by Viet Cong supply units. The food had been destined for a Mekong Delta relief phalanx run by the Catholic Relief Service.

In four weeks later, an express train heading north from Saigon bounced from the rails when the Viet Cong detonated a mine under it. Ten tons of surplus American food was dragged into the jungles by a big band of guerrillas. Another 10 tons was when another train suffered the same fate two weeks later.

This food was heading to hungry communities in central South Viet Nam which have been fed for years by the Catholic Relief Service.

It is incidents such as these, says Catholic Relief Service director Father Robert Barrett, that make the business of voluntary food distribution in South Viet Nam "not only difficult, but positively dangerous."

HELPING FOR 10 YEARS
Father Barrett's organization has been helping the needy of South Viet Nam for nearly 10 years. Many of those assisted

The three men now are serving a prison sentence in New Brunswick for another crime. Three young men brandishing revolvers robbed a branch of the Bank of Montreal here of \$25,000 last month after it opened in the morning.

Take a hand like this one. It occurred in the World Pair Championship played in Canada in 1962. At most tables South was declarer at five diamonds and made it by means of a squeeze.

West led the club. Declarer took the ace and the king, losing the queen to the ace. East returned n the nine of clubs.
