CHOICE COMPLETED OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister Diefenbaker said Thursday the government has completed its choice of personnel who will administer the \$1,000,000 Queen's Fund for research in children's diseases. The fund was established as the country's gift to Queen Elizabeth on her Canadian tour this summer. Mr. Diefenbaker told reporters he is awaiting the Queen's approval of the personnel before announcing the names.

WILL CUT FLIGHT TIME LONDON (AP)—A Pan American jet flew from San Francisco to London Thursday in a little more than 13 hours flying time. The Boeing 707, carrying 124 passengers, flew via Boston instead of refuelling at Frobisher Bay in the Northwest Territories. A spokesman said the air line will begin using the Arctic route in about three weeks. The flight will then take 11 1/2 hours flying time.
