## Assault Charges Are Dismissed

Charges of assault against two Ocean View men were dismissed in Queen's County magistrate's court yesterday when a Magistrate James B. Johnston found too much discrepancy in evidence on behalf of the Crown to prove their guilt.

The pair, William John Larkin and Charles Theodore McGuigan, had pleaded not guilty to charges of assaulting Eugene Nazarus McGuigan of Iona. The plaintiff said that the two had attacked him in his car and hit him in the face.

Evidence for the defence was that Eugene Nazarus McGuigan had made the first move by coming at the defendants with a screw driver and their eyes only protecting themselves. Lester O'Donnell was the defence counsel.

Testifying in the case were the defendants and Wayne Charles McGuigan 15, nephew of the two McGuigans. Duncan MacLean, 72, of Crapaud was found not guilty of possession of a quantity of wine suitable for the manufacture of spirits but convicted of possession of illegal beer and fined \$50 and costs or one month.
