3 juillet 1906

Sur le désir exprimé par plusieurs pèlerins de l'an dernier, et dans le but de procurer des ressources pour le développement de l'œuvre de l'éducation, nous avons décidé, avec la très encourageante approbation de sa Grandeur, Monseigneur de Saint Jean, l'organisation d'un second pèlerinage.
