"All right, what's in the refrigerator?"

ELEGANT CLUB SANDWICH

"I see frankfurters, lettuce, tomatoes and a little mayonnaise. There's plenty of bread, too," reported Diane. "Could I use these to make an elegant club sandwich that would look like a picture in your column, Granny?"

"You can try," I laughed.

"And here are four nice ripe bananas, some orange juice and a package of my favorite coconut. Could I do something new with these to surprise Mommie?" asked Lynn.

TWO SURPRISE DISHES

Armed with a measuring cup and a set of measuring spoons—each girl made a surprise dish.

Mayonnaise was transferred into Thousand Island dressing used in making frankfurter club-style sandwiches. They were not exactly "elegant," but very good to look at and to taste.

The banana-orange juice combination finally turned into a fruit cup, which was delectable.

"COOKING IS FUN!"

After the dishes were washed and the kitchen was put in order, the girls agreed that "cooking is fun!"

A surprise visit from the Chef, who showed the girls how to arrange an appetizing pear and cheese tray, made the day even more perfect.

MEASUREMENTS ARE LEVEL

Thousand Island dressing: For salad sandwiches, with green salad, or as a cold sauce with broiled fish or smoked tongue.

To ¾ c. mayonnaise add 2 tsp. chili sauce, ½ tsp. minced parsley, 1 tsp. pickle relish and 1 chopped hard-cooked egg.

Makes 1½ c.

Diane's frankfurter club-style sandwiches: For each person toast 2 slices enriched bread.

Spread Thousand Island dressing on one slice; top with thin-sliced fresh tomato and pan-broiled frankfurters split lengthwise in halves, then cut in quarters.

Slightly crush leaf of lettuce and add.

Cover with second slice of toast. Fasten together with 4 wooden picks.

Cut in squares. Remove picks. Serve warm.

Garnish of lettuce and carrot curls.

Lynn's banana-orange juice cup: For each person, peel and slice into dessert glass or large sherbet cup, 1 medium-size banana. Half-cover with chilled orange juice.

Dust with canned flaked coconut; serve at once.

TOMORROW'S DINNER

Tomato juice cocktail, smoked beef tongue, parsleyed carrots, quick mashed potatoes, tossed cucumber salad, banana-orange juice cup, coffee, milk, tea.

THE CHEF'S PEAR AND CHEESE TRAY

Easy enough for a child to prepare; sophisticated enough for a smart hostess to serve.

In centre of large wicker tray put medium-small cheese board containing wedge of aged cheddar.
