New Director Is Appointed For Oceanography Institute

OTTAWA (CP)—Dr. William L. Ford, 51, a Canadian marine scientist and administrator, has been appointed director of the Bedford Institute of Oceanography, Dartmouth, N.S., by the civil service commission. Successor Minister Benoit announced here.

The institute serves as Canada's East Coast centre for activities in hydrography, oceanography, geophysics, chemistry and geology in Atlantic and sub-Arctic waters. It also houses the Atlantic oceanographic group of fisheries research.

A former scientific adviser to the chief of the naval staff, Dr. Ford was superintendent of the Pacific Naval Laboratory at Esquimalt, B.C., from 1955 to 1959, and in August of 1959, returned here as scientific adviser to the chief of naval staff. It November 1963, he was appointed chief of personnel.
