**P. E. I. Libraries Held Convention**

Branch librarians of the Prince Edward Island Libraries held their annual convention at Library Headquarters, Prince of Wales College, on October 13th and 14th. The sessions got underway Wednesday afternoon with a review of the activities of the past year by Miss Dorothy Cullen, Librarian. She mentioned the changed location of the libraries in Morrell Summerside, and St. Peter's and welcomed the new librarians from Morrell, Mrs. J.F. MacInnis, and from St. Peter's, Mr. J.H. MacInnis. There were also some changes in the staff at Headquarters during the year.

A discussion of reading promotion methods followed a statement on the use of library books during 1956. It was shown that the number of books read was above the average of the years 1951-55.

The librarians find that television seems to be providing stiff competition for reading as a leisure time activity, but it is hoped that, as has happened in other centres, books will regain people's interest after the novelty of TV has worn off.

A new book list for young people was presented and discussed. This list, "Book Bait", prepared by the American Library Association, gives detailed summaries of adult books that are popular with teen-agers and suggests titles to follow each one listed. Another useful list "Books for Youth" is published by the Toronto Public Library.

The P.E.I. Libraries lists of books for young people were also found helpful.

On Wednesday evening a film program was presented, including a film "The Librarian" sponsored by the Canadian Library Association, and "New Chapters", which portrays the varied activities of the London Public Library.

Thursday morning's session opened with some reminders by Headquarters staff on pro-

cedures of registration of borrowers, circulation of books, and loans to schools.

A talk on classification of books by Miss Cullen concentrated on technical books, and showed the method of keeping books on the same and related subjects together by means of a number assigned to each book. The way to locate a book on a particular topic was demonstrated with a chart and index prepared by Miss Ena Murphy of Library Headquarters.

All the librarians joined in a discussion of the observance of Young Canada's Book Week, scheduled this year for Nov. 15-22. It was suggested that in case the library is too small to accommodate visits by school classes, the librarian should visit the school to talk about books and the library.
