**New Jet Age Touches Off Battle Over Fare Rates**

**MONTREAL (CP)** - The birth of the jet age in commercial aviation has touched off a battle among airlines that could conceivably lead to a breakdown of the machinery and procedures developed during the last decade to set

international air fares. The dispute centres largely around the issue of whether passengers should be allowed to ride the new jet airliners for the same price as they ride the older, piston-engine aircraft.

Another area of disagreement is over the desirability of introducing special low rates in an effort to build up transatlantic air freight movement. Some industry authorities see this as a logical step in solving the problem of utilizing conventional aircraft put out of passenger service by the jets.

**LOCK OFF MEETING**  
 Lack of agreement on these two issues last fall forced an adjournment of the traffic conferences of the International Air Transport Association which was convened to draft the structure of international fares and rates for the year beginning April 1.

At the time, conference chairman Philip Lawton, commercial director of British European Airways, said the recess was designed to give carriers time to consider their position on these issues, which arise from the introduction into service of jet aircraft.

IATA's Montreal headquarters announced the conference would be resumed Feb. 15 in Paris in an effort to reach some sort of agreement before present regulations become inoperative in two months.

Failure to reach an agreement would result in an "open rate situation." **DOG-EAT-DOG**  
 One aviation source put it this way: "Everyone would then go ahead on his own. It would mean a dog-eat-dog arrangement. It couldn't last long."

IATA, representing most of the Free World's airlines, normally sets the rate structures in October or November through an unanimous vote of its members. The rates must then be approved by governments of the countries in-

cluded. In any conference an member airline has the power to air absolute veto over proceedings. The only airlines actually operating jets - British Overseas Airways Corporation and Pan American World Airways - carry passengers on their Comets and Boeing 707s at the same fares that are charged for conventional liners.

They are determined to block attempts to establish a "jet surcharge" which some airlines have insisted should be as high as 3 per cent. If such a charge were accepted it would be added to normal fares.

The fight for the surcharge waged by Spain's Iberia Airlines and Italy's Alitalia.

Critics of IATA's rate - fixing methods argue that fares adopted are always high enough to protect small, high-cost operators. They claim that the biggest, most efficient lines could carry passengers at lower fares than at present if this method of fare-setting had never been adopted.

So far Alitalia has refused to agree to any fare structure that does not include a jet surcharge. BOAC, Pan American and other supporters refused to agree to any which does.

Italy, meanwhile, has refused to permit Pan American jets to land at Rome, claiming the airport not suitable for them.

The battle over the rate structure for the next year is further complicated by the indication that some airlines plan to ask for fare reductions on normal runs.

Trans - Canada Air Lines strongly opposed to the jet surcharge and warned IATA's conference last fall that it will request lower transatlantic fares the next year.

British European Airways said it will seek the introduction of cheaper, economy class fares if European routes. Economy fares were introduced last April on the Atlantic and sparked the greatest traffic movement the airline have ever known over the route.

BOAC has also warned IAT that jet operators soon will demand lower international fares. BEA
