Survey Shows Europeans Are Smoking Much As Ever

LONDON (AP)—The people of Europe are smoking as much as ever in some countries, they're smoking more.

Two years ago, Britain's Royal Society of Medicine published a report linking lung cancer with cigarette smoking. In January, United States brought out a report saying that smoking adversely affects health.

Ethnic Groups Across Canada Assured No Threat Exists

HAMILTON, Ont. (CP)—Guy Rouleau, parliamentary secretary to Prime Minister Pearson, said Saturday night ethnic groups need not fear any threat to their language and culture in the current emphasis on bilingualism and biculturalism.

Mr. Rouleau, addressing the annual meeting of the Hamilton East Liberal Association, said the fact other languages and cultures than English and French are not mentioned in the British North America Act does not mean that it has to be relinquished.

"Certainly, there are people in Quebec who speak a language that is not French," he said. "Any group of two or three people in any part of the country can draw the attention of the entire nation—and all the headlines—if their political action is spectacular enough."

French black tobacco. There is no campaign against smoking. It is increasing.

ITALY
Despite a government ban on tobacco advertising, the number of smokers continues to rise. Tobacco is a government monopoly and furnishes about 10 per cent of the state's revenue.

WEST GERMANY
Cigarette smoking has been increasing steadily while cigar and pipe smoking—relatively insignificant anyway—have declined.

FRANCE
The French tobacco industry—a state business—published a booklet in July, 1962, reporting a statistical relationship between smoking and lung cancer.

SWEDEN
The Swedes are not given to heavy smoking, yet smoking has increased steadily in recent years. Health authorities are working on a detailed report on smoking habits.

NETHERLANDS
Sales of pipes and cigars rose and some tobaccoists say this has offset a slump in sales of cigarettes.

NORWAY
Health Director Karl Eyang says the government will look into possibilities of changing taxation to benefit types of tobacco other than cigarettes.

POLAND
The American report was published but no official steps have been taken yet, are expected. Smoking has increased 40 per cent since 1956. Cigarettes are not advertised.

SOVIET UNION
Neither the British nor the American smoking report received publicity here. Production of cigarettes is a state monopoly and anti-smoking propaganda is sporadic and uncoordinated.

DENMARK
Clear smoking among women, long a custom here, has become

The provincial attorney general's department, which operates the Cache Lake camp, says the men are paid 75 cents a day on a six-day week basis.

They clear bush for access roads, erect and repair sites for tourist camps. Dikes and other tasks are assigned by the provincial forestry service.
