Eden's Condition Shows Improvement

LONDON, (Reuters) — Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden, convalescing in hospital after his second major operation this month, "had a less restless night," the foreign office said Sunday. Eden, 55, had his first operation April 12 for removal of gall stones. His second operation last week removed fluid from his liver duct, which had caused persistent jaundice.

Broadway Star Of Early 30's Dies

NEW YORK, (AP) — Katherine (Kay) Carrington, 43-year-old star of Broadway musicals in the early '30s, died Saturday of a cerebral hemorrhage. Miss Carrington, a tall and beautiful blonde, achieved stardom in a 1931 musical, "Face the Music." Another triumph soon afterward was "Music in the Air."

Army Picks "Z" Hour For Coronation

LONDON, (Reuters) — The army has officially given the name "Z" hour to the moment Queen Elizabeth is crowned June 2. A colonel of army signals stationed in Westminster Abbey will telephone the order that sends guns booming over London at the exact second the crown is placed on the Queen's head.

Ask For Transport

In London, British Foreign Office sources said France has asked Britain for transport planes for use in Indo-China. The request came on the heels of a Washington announcement that requested "critically needed" military supplies are being rushed to the aid of Laos defenders.

No Survivors

A ground rescue party reached the wreckage Sunday afternoon and reported none of the 37 passengers and crew of six had survived the crash, which occurred 22 miles northwest of Calcutta in barren country. Preliminary reports said the crash may have been caused by a fire or explosion shortly after take-off.

Savage Battle In Trenches

SEOUL, Korea (CP) — Canadian troops fought off a whirlwind Chinese Communist attack that raged 2 1/2 hours inside Allied lines on the western sector of the Korean front late Saturday night and early Sunday.

Artillery Barrage

The fighting began about midnight Saturday with a 1,000-round barrage of Communist artillery and mortar fire on Commonwealth division position northeast of Korangpo between Little Gibraltar Hill and the Hook.
