Arts School Set For Next Year

ENGLISH — Reggie Porter, chairman of the Arts Foundation, has announced classes at the foundation summer school will be resumed at the same time next summer. The school recently closed its doors following a full summer of activities. Open house for the school was held following the closing, and information on the past summer courses and lectures was given by the teachers. On display were books, valued at \$300, used during the six weeks, and later donated to Margaret Conroy, librarian for the school. A display of art completed by the students was shown by the teacher, Alma Bute, who was one of the leaders in setting up the school at Tinian, and who has since resigned because of pressure of other business. The last week of activities at the school was a full one. Besides a discussion leaders' training course, held for five evenings by Mr. and Mrs. Stenilus MacKieck of Montreal, two piano recitals and lectures were given by Laura Fink of Montreal. Her emphasis was on those composers who contributed to the growth of the technical resources and the development of the expressive power of the piano — Bach, Mozart, Beethoven, Field, Chopin and Debussy. Her second lecture and concert was on modern music, seen in the light of its evolution out of the music of the past. Frank Pridham, president of Harvey Studios Limited and a guest of Queen Mother Elizabeth at a garden party July 7, showed slides at the school. Mr. Pridham showed beautiful scenes of Montrose where he was born and where he spends much of his summer holidays. He also showed a famous and unusual camera which he owns and which is being sought by many different museums. Others lending to the school's summer classes and activities were: Canadian folksinger Alan Mills, with Jean Carrigan, traditional fiddler; and Bram Morrison, guitarist; Christopher Giedhill, director of music for the department of education for the Island; Dr. J.H. Maloney, outstanding authority on early Indians of P.E.I.; J. Henri Gaudier, who studied organ music in Canada and Europe. Rev. Adrien Arseneault, St. Dunstan's University; Reid Sanzger provincial director of marketing and director of the resources development program for P.E.I.; Mrs. Anne Ludlow, assistant dean, and the dean, Arthur Assum, both of the University of Rochester, New York.

Impaired Driving Conviction Draws \$125 And Costs Fine

Spurgeon Richard Currie of Rocky Point, charged with drunken driving, Saturday pleaded guilty to the lesser charge of driving while impaired and was fined \$125 and costs or 30 days. This was one of 15 cases handled by Magistrate A. James Haslam, QC, in city police court. Two residents of Clyde River and Johnston's River were each fined \$20 and costs or 30 days for illegal possession of liquor. Eugene Joseph Gallant, city, arraigned on a charge of attempted theft had his case adjourned until Sept. 11. He was released on bail. Kenneth Kneebone, city, charged with failing to yield right of way, was fined \$10 and costs or five days. Robert A.J. MacDonald, city, charged with driving without due care and attention, had his case adjourned until Aug. 25. Fred Reid, city, charged with causing damage to property, was remanded, without bail, until Aug. 24. Barry Bradley, city, drew a fine of \$10 and costs or five days when he pleaded guilty to the charge of failing to stop at a flashing red light. James Arthur McIsaac, Kensington, pleaded guilty to a charge of speeding and was fined \$24 and costs or 15 days. Constable Warren MacKenzie of the Parkdale Police Force said the man was taken to hospital by Hennessey's ambulance but was released upon examination. His condition was not serious, said the constable, who added that police are usually notified after the fight is over and not when the action first takes place. There were two or three others involved but their names were not known.

Morning Race Draws Crowd

The first morning races ever staged on Prince Edward Island and possibly in the Maritimes saw a crowd large enough to dispel any fears officials had for the success of such a venture. The reference is to Friday afternoon's racing card which was postponed because of rain but went Saturday morning under clear skies at the Charlottetown Driving Park. Officials reported that Friday night's card, which included the \$3,000 Evening Patriot Gold Cup and Saucer event, established an all-time record for betting as patrons led \$59,948 into the parimutuel covering the eight dashes.

Bedeque Man Dies In B.C.

SUMMERSIDE — A former Bedeque resident, Robert Scott Leard, 69, died recently in Vancouver. At the time of his death he was a director of Super Valu Stores, Kelly Douglas and Co., Nabob Foods Ltd., Wrights Canadian Ropes Ltd., and Dickson Importing Co. He served in the First World War with the Canadian Field Artillery. In 1919 he went to Vancouver and joined Bloedel, Stewart and Welsh, a lumber firm. In 1951 he became vice-president of sales and a director of the lumber company.

When the firm merged with H.R. MacMillan export company later the same year he was appointed a director and vice-president of the newly-formed MacMillan and Bioedel Co. He retired in 1952 for health reasons. Past director of the metropolitan board of the YMCA, he was a member of the Shaughnessy Heights United Church, the Vancouver Club and Shaughnessy Golf Club. He is survived by his wife, Bernice; son, Allan David; daughter, Mrs. A.B. Elworthy, all of Vancouver; daughter, Mrs. Harry E. Bell of Montreal; brother David and sister Amy of Vancouver and eight grandchildren. The funeral service was held Monday afternoon at Shaughnessy United Church.
