## SIR CHARLES TUPPER'S ATTACK.

The vigor displayed by Sir Charles Tupper augurs well for the success of his party. His attack upon the Government in the course of his speech upon the address caused Sir Richard Cartwright to lose his temper. It is evident that the Government cannot, possibly, take a defence which will satisfy the people of Canada. Sir Charles Tupper's speech was full of Canadian spirit. The opposition leader is not the man to truckle to the keen and contemptuous politicians at Washington. "It is my opinion," he said, "that the interests of Canada required, not that there should be an adjournment (of the Joint High Commission,) but a suspension of these negotiations. . . . The time has come when the world should know that we are not in the humiliating and dependent position of being obliged to cringe as supplicants at the feet of the United States on any consideration whatever. . . . The feeling throughout the whole of this country is that the position of Canada would be infinitely higher, stronger, and better to day if that High Joint Commission had never been heard of." There can be no question that upon this point Sir Charles represents the sentiments of the manhood of Canada.

As to the plebiscite, he referred to the fact that the conditions under which it was taken "were deliberately made such as to crush the enthusiasm of the temperance advocates". But, after all, it is to be noted, a majority of 14,000 was polled in favor of prohibition; and now the Government refuses to act in accordance with the plebiscite (their own plebiscite), because there was not polled in favor of prohibition "a majority of the whole electorate." This condition has never yet been imposed in Canada in respect to any proposition or question. It may be argued that prohibition would be useless unless a majority of the whole electorate were in favor of it. But the Government is not in a position to argue in that way. They held the plebiscite at a cost of \$250,000 of the people's money, and they are, in reason, and in duty, bound to abide by the result. In respect to all public matters the majority vote governs; and having put the matter to the vote the Government are bound to abide by and act upon the result of the vote. Upon the plebiscite question, also, Sir Charles has the Government completely before the wind. As he says, "the whole thing was a shameless imposition."

Then, as to Senate reform, Sir Charles says:—"Search every country where Parliamentary institutions exist, and I defy you to show me one single case in which so monstrous, so absurd, and so utterly untenable a proposal (Sir Wilfrid's Senate reform scheme) was ever made as that to which the Premier has committed himself."

If the Government cannot meet this challenge—and they cannot—Sir Charles must also carry with him, upon this point, the intelligence and British manhood of the country.

## THE CASTILIAN ENQUIRY.

Expert Evidence Cabled - What Captain Barrett Has to Say.

YARMOUTH, March 22. -- Yesterday Captain Arthur McGraw, of the steamer Prince George, and Captain Campbell, of the steamer Aberdeen, were called as experts and testified as to the remarkable drift at certain times in the Bay of Fundy. Captain Barrett, of the Castilian made his statement. There was little in it that has not already been made public. He found nothing in his sounding on occasion any alarm until he got 17 fathoms at 3 30 a. m. Then on consulting his chart he thought he had overrun his distance and reached the outer bank of Seal Island. He turned out to avoid Braz I Rock which he thought he was then near, when he found 10 fathoms shortly after and breakers reported. In his judgment at the time he did right in putting her hard about, though he saw that had he stopped and gone full speed ast-ru he might have saved the ship. He was asked the question if there was a possibility of anyone tampering with his compasses at Portland. He thought not, though they had some undiscovered had fellow on board who had cut their log line at the taffrail and they had to get a new one at Portland. ## French-British Frontier.

LONDON, March 22.--The convention between Great and France, delimitating their respective frontiers in the valley of the Nile, was signed last night by the Marquis of Salisbury and the French ambassador, M. Paul Cambon, respectively. Broadly stated the terms of the convention are as follows: The exact frontier from the northern line of the Belgian Congo to Lat 15, is to be determined by a mixed commission, it being agreed that: Great Britain shall retain Bahr-El-Ghazal, with Darfur. France to keep Wadei (or Wadei) west Darfur, Bagirmir, south of Lake Chad, Kanom, north of Lake Chad, and generally speaking, the territory east and north of Lake Chad, lying north of the fifteenth parallel.

The French sphere will extend south of the tropic of Cancer to the western limit of the Libyan Desert.

The signatories agree to equality of commercial treatment from the Nile to Lake Chad, and between the fifth and fifteenth parallels of latitude.

The latter clause permits France to establish commercial houses on the Nile and its affluents. The signatories will undertake to refrain from exercising political or territorial rights outside the frontiers fixed by the convention.

## A Series of Explosions.

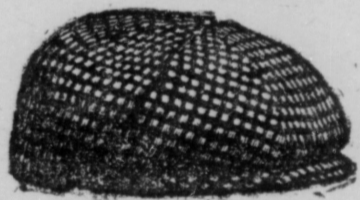
