**Italy Makes Quarter-finals**

LONDON, (AP)—Italy clinched the seventh berth in the quarter-finals of the European zone Davis Cup tennis tournament Sunday and England got off to a good start in the battle for the last position.

Belgium, Sweden, France, Germany, Chile and Denmark ran up quick, decisive leads Saturday to move into the round of eight.

Italy's doubles team of Nicola Pietrangeli and Giuseppe Merlo easily bested Poland's Pietek and Radzio at Warsaw, 6-3, 6-2, 6-4, for a 3-0 advantage in their best of five series.

England won the opening singles match from Yugoslavia at Belgrade and held a commanding lead in the other when it was halted by darkness. Roger Becker, 22-year-old Briton, defeated Josip Palada, 6-4, 6-0, 6-2, in a rain-interrupted match. Bill Knight, 20, led Yugoslavia's Ilija Panajotovic, 6-4, 6-4, 5-2, when darkness forced a halt. The match will be completed today.

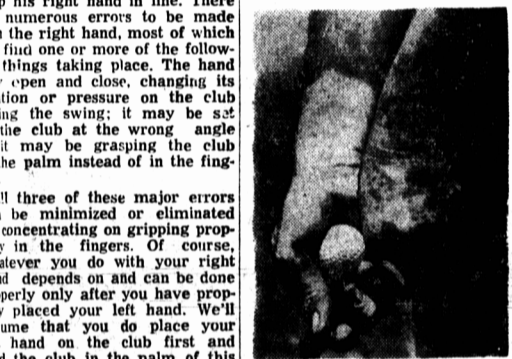
**TIPS ON GOLFING**

**Exercise For Finger Grip**

Most golfers know that the club should be held only with a finger grip by the right hand. Very few have learned to do this. Perhaps the best reason for this is that the right hand sort of takes charge of what the player does to prevent it.

Such a statement is not altogether accurate. The situation is more like this, the player doesn't do the proper thing to keep his right hand in line. There are numerous errors to be made with the right hand, most of which will find one or more of the following things taking place. The hand may open and close, changing its position or pressure on the club during the swing; it may be set on the club at the wrong angle or it may be grasping the club in the palm instead of in the fingers.



All three of these major errors can be minimized or eliminated by concentrating on gripping properly in the fingers. Of course, whatever you do with your right hand depends on and can be done properly only after you have properly placed your left hand. We'll assume that you do place your left hand on the club first and hold the club in the palm of this hand firmly with the left little fingers. Then you should have no trouble gripping properly with the right fingers.

If you allow only the heel of your right hand to press against your left thumb your right hand can maintain an open position
