Jack Turner Announces Team's Plans

It was announced yesterday that the Charlottetown YMCA Gymnastic Team will represent the province at the Canadian Winter Games to be held in Quebec, in February, 1967. The announcement was made by Jack Turner, Chairman of Gymnastics of the AAU of C for P.E.I. Committee for the Canadian Winter Games.

Members of the gymnastic team have been working out regularly throughout the summer months in preparation for this event, and, starting Tuesday, September 27th, will meet every Tuesday and Friday evenings at the local "Y" through-out the fall and winter months. Eight competitors, four boys and four girls, will be chosen for the team.

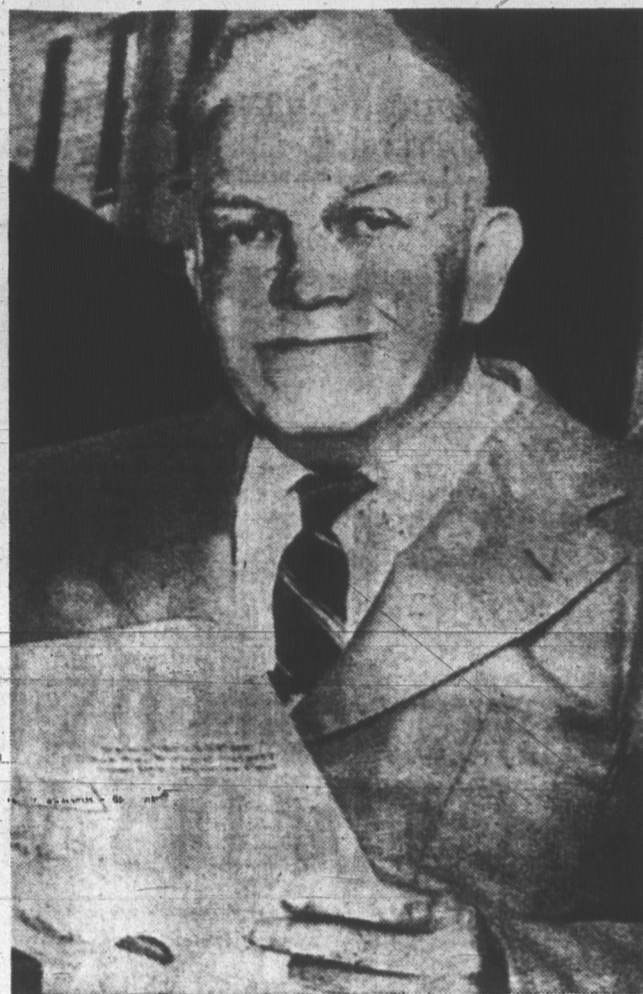
The boy competitors have to be under 21 years of age and will be required to work out on six different sections of apparatus: — High Bar, Parallel Bars, Vaulting, Pommel Horse, Free Exercises and Rings. The girls' section have to compete on Balance Beam, Free Exercises, Vaulting and uneven Parallel Bars and must be 18 years of age and under.

Mr. Turner stated that students attending University from other Provinces would be eligible to represent the Province at the Winter Games and he hoped that any University students or gymnasts throughout the Island who are eligible, would attend the training sessions to try out for a spot on the team.

Quebec Separatist Opposes Special Program For Queen

MONTREAL (CP) — Pierre Bourgeois, leader of the Rassemblement pour l'Indépendance nationale, said here that if the Queen receives special treatment during her visit to the world's fair next year he does not know what will happen, "but anything is possible."

Mr. Bourgeois said in an interview the position of his separatist party on the subject of the Queen's visit is clear.

"If she comes to Expo as Queen of England and she is received in the same way as other foreign sovereigns who honor us with visits during Expo, nothing will happen, there won't be a stir. But if, on the other hand, she enjoys special treatment, I don't know what will happen, but anything is possible."

Mr. Bourgeois said he wanted it to be clear that the words "anything is possible" were in no way intended as a menace.

He denied that the RIN has for some months been urging
