Moncton Hawks Set Stage For Friday With 4-2 Win

MONCTON (CP) — Moncton Hawks shot back into a first place tie in the Atlantic Coast Senior Hockey League Wednesday night as they dumped last-place Fredericton Capitals 4-2.

Scoring once in the first period, twice in the middle frame and once more in the third period, the Hawks outshot, outplayed and outbumped the listless Capitals who had shut them out 5-0 Tuesday night.

Playing coach Dugger McNeil of the Hawks, who needed repairs for a cut over the eye in the second period, opened the scoring at 1:22 of the first.

Nick Nicolle got that one back at 15:24 of the first. Bill Sinnett pumped home two fast markers as the second period opened, and Moncton's Dewar Thomson capped the rally when he connected at 7:45. Doug McPhee shot Fredericton's only goal of the third period.

Moncton now is tied with Charlottetown Islanders for the league lead with 55 points each.
