### WEST PRINCE ELECTION.

Means by Which Hackett Was Worsted.

Perry's Majority Placed at 83.

Despite the most systematic corruption on the part of the Government party, Mr. Hackett was beaten here yesterday by but 83 votes. Emissaries of the Federal Administration, thick as June bugs, marshalled by Mr. Private Secretary Williams and Mr. John Yeo, M. P., operated in every quarter. Emissaries of the Peters' Government headed by Warburton, accompanied by professional experts in handling whiskey and money and flanked by Rogers, Matheson, McLellan (Assistant Clerk of the Legislative Assembly) also by Land Office officials were in the riding since nomination day. Federal grants to public works were kept dangling before the people with a Ministers instructions to spread the swag when it would be most effectual. Poor people were sadly tempted, by money freely offered them, to stay at home. Catholic influence against the School Settlement was sadly impaired by divisions, even among the clergy, and Protestant feeling was inflamed by untruthful reports secretly circulated from house to house regarding "priestly interference" with our own schools. In a word, all the powers of darkness were arrayed against us.

Honorable James Yeo demonstrated his influence in the Second District, which resisted the tempter splendidly.

All honorable men here admire Mr. Hackett's manly fight, and sympathize with him in the foul-stealing of his seat. Left to himself and Perry, the West Prince election would have been a walk-over for him. As it is, the Conservatives here are not dismayed, but jubilant.

### INTERESTING NEWS NOTES SELECTED FOR THE EXAMINER.

King George of Greece is reported as saying that there was no occasion for Turkey going to war with him, and that there would have been no war had it not been for outside intriguers. If the chronicler is not misrepresenting things, King George is a bit of a baby. If Greece did not want war he should have kept his people quiet.

Rafiz Pasha, eighty years old, refusing to dismount and rest, because in the battles of nineteen years ago he had not quitted his saddle, and leading his corps, though twice wounded till he was stricken by a third and fatal shot—makes a heroic figure that any army might be proud of. It seems half a pity that he was a Turk.

"The Turk" is just now the object of a good deal of discussion, ranging in character from the lurid lyrics of William Watson to the rapid Voltairianism of John Morley. There has been no decade for a century past which has not seen a like outbreak of prophecy and platitudes about "the Turk," and his abominations, his cruelties, his treacheries; the nuisance he is, and the necessity for suppressing him. Emperors and Presidents, Prime Ministers and diplomats, newspapers and Nobodies, M. P., have all combined to declare, at regular periods, personal hostility to "the Turk." But the Turk remains, a little shorn of territory, a little curtailed of power, and a little better instructed in the methods of writing men and talking houses, and in the way of obstructing their various and conflicting policies. But the talking Houses and the writing men go on setting the question of life or death for the Turk in an apparently happy ignorance of the futility of their efforts.
