Germany and the Philippines

LONDON, April 24.—The Daily Chronicle says: We are informed that during the Hispano-American war, Germany proposed to the United States the cession of a coaling station in the Philippines in the event of annexation, together with the exchange of commercial privileges. The United States replied that the proposal was premature, especially in view of the uncertainty as to the way the public would regard the request. Later, Germany asked the United States not to annex the Caroline Islands, claiming the first right to them herself and renewing her request for a coaling station in the Philippines in exchange for Islands in the Marshall and Brown groups, east of the Carolines. The United States repeated that the question was premature, and the negotiations are still in abeyance.

Disarmament Conference.

THE HAGUE, April 24.—The people of the Netherlands are annoyed at the fact that the Transvaal Government was not invited to take part in the disarmament conference. The Netherlands Government is being attacked in consequence. Allegations are made that the failure to send an invitation to the Boer Government was due to the fear of offending England.
