Police Continue Investigation In S'side Holdup

As far as could be learned over the weekend, Summerside police have not apprehended anyone in connection with the daring hold-up and robbery of Mr. Ted Perry on Convent Street Friday night when two men assaulted Perry in his garage and stole approximately \$200. from him. Following a series of breaks into canteens and small places of business, and car thefts during the past week, an attempt was made on Saturday night to force entry into the meat market of Medius Wedge on Myrtle Street. THE DEEP BLUE SEA CAPITAL THEATRE SUMMERSIDE

S'side Girls Win From Miscouche In Softball Game

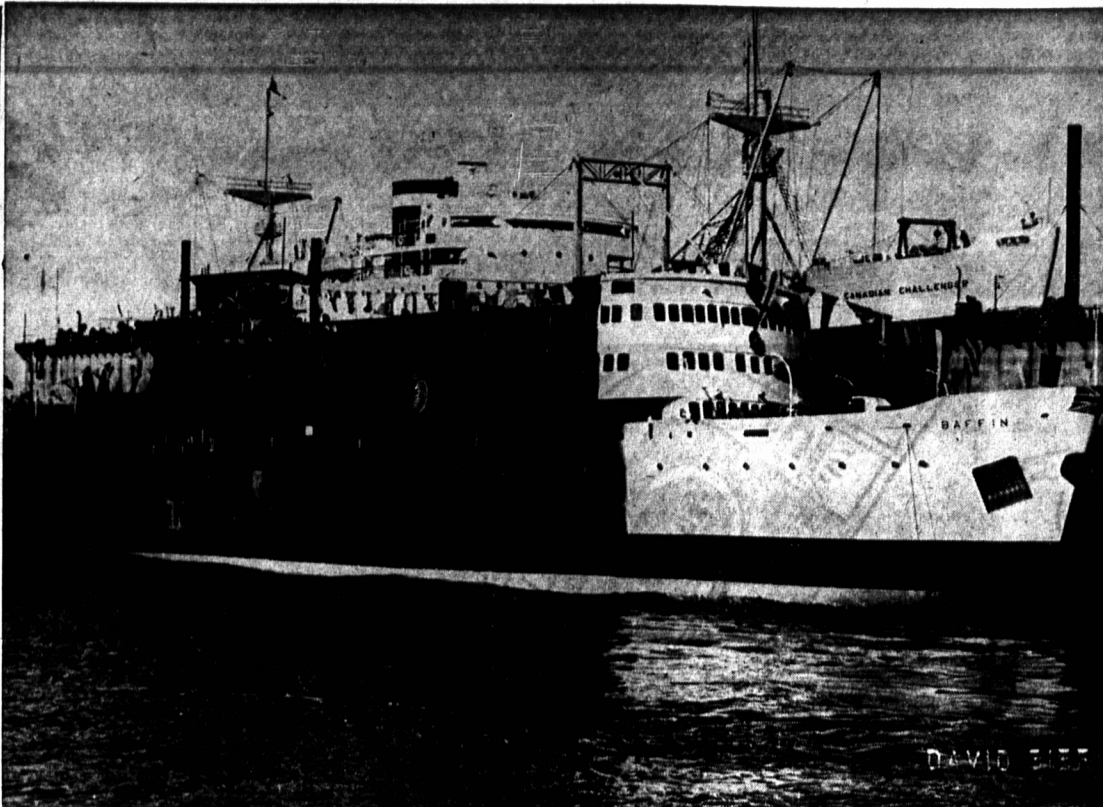

DESIGNED FOR ARCTIC

"The Thomson Company is grateful for the friendly and co-operative way their entry into the Prince Edward Island field has been received. I hope to merit the treatment received. Now Mr. Thomson is well known for his insistence on building the company's newspapers in modern structures. "I have been through this building. I have been associated with some of the openings of new or reconstructed buildings of the Thomson group of which there seems to be one about once a year. "This one we are in today is the most completely modern of all I have seen and is considerably more spacious than had yet been provided for papers of its size of circulation. It is obvious it has been planned to serve not 100,000 population on Island but 150,000 or more.

A LASTING MEMORIAL

"While we fervently pray that this new building shall never be destroyed until it has served its time and usefulness, we know that those of us who are participating in this ceremony, will soon be forgotten and this ceremony itself shall fade from the memories of us all, yet there is one thing that should gain from this ceremony, and that is a sense of the freedom we enjoy in living in a democracy where we can enjoy freedom of speech, and where the press is not throttled. "We, in Charlottetown, have enjoyed a newspaper since the year 1787, the first paper being the Royal Commercial Gazette and Intelligence. This was followed by the Royal Gazette and the Miscellany of the Island of St. John 1791, the Royal Herald in 1800, the Recorder in 1811 and about twenty-five others in succession before Confederation. Some were dailies, some were weeklies, some survived only a few years. These were the forerunners of the Charlottetown Guardian, which appeared first in the year 1872.

FORMER LIST BOY
