

City League Volleyball Finals Start Tonight

The Basilica Youth Club defending City League and Island champions and their arch rivals the Y. M. C. A. Micmacs play the first three games of their best 5 of 9 series for the City League Volleyball Championship, tonight at the Y. M. C. A. beginning at 6 o'clock.

During the regular season B. Y. C. finished the regular season just three points ahead of the Micmacs whose late season drive failed to get them to the top.

In the semi-finals there was little doubt as to who the finalists would be. B. Y. C. polished off the firemen in four straight games while the Micmacs were showing little more mercy to the Independents knocking them off

by the same margin, four games to none.
