NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market moved ahead briskly Friday and made new records in some averages because they already were at historic high levels.

The big financial event of the day was Chrysler's offering to subscribe to 5,611,360 shares of common stock at \$48 a share, at the rate of one share for each seven shares held.

The Chrysler stock rights began trading at noon on a transaction of 500,000 at \$1. The rights closed at \$1.10, on total turnover of 120,000 shares.

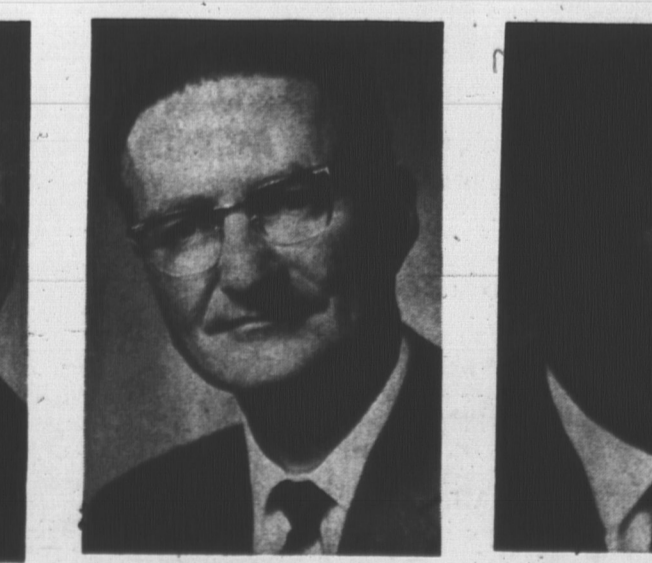
R. Grant Mollison
