The financial statement showed a very successful year with \$1927.74 profit from the rink, canteen and annual picnic. The mortgage was paid during the year for \$700.00. Notes of \$478.60 were also paid and sundry bills to the total of \$1203.86, leaving a credit balance in bank account of \$940.00. It was decided to purchase a \$500 Prince Edward Island Government bond as an investment.

A committee was appointed to look into the matter of the building of a new rink. It was also decided to issue and sell one hundred shares at \$10 a share in the company. The financial statement of the O'Leary girls hockey team was presented by Mrs. Marne Kennedy and a surplus of fifty some dollars was present in the bank. Mr. James Bagiole presented the statement for the Maroons hockey team, and this also showed a worthwhile surplus.

A committee was appointed of Mrs. Marne Kennedy, Wendall Turner, Oban Wedge, Claud MacNeill and James Bagiole to form a hockey club, and look into the matter of acquiring a coach.

Mite blinked. "What do you mean he hasn't seen me?" he squeaked.

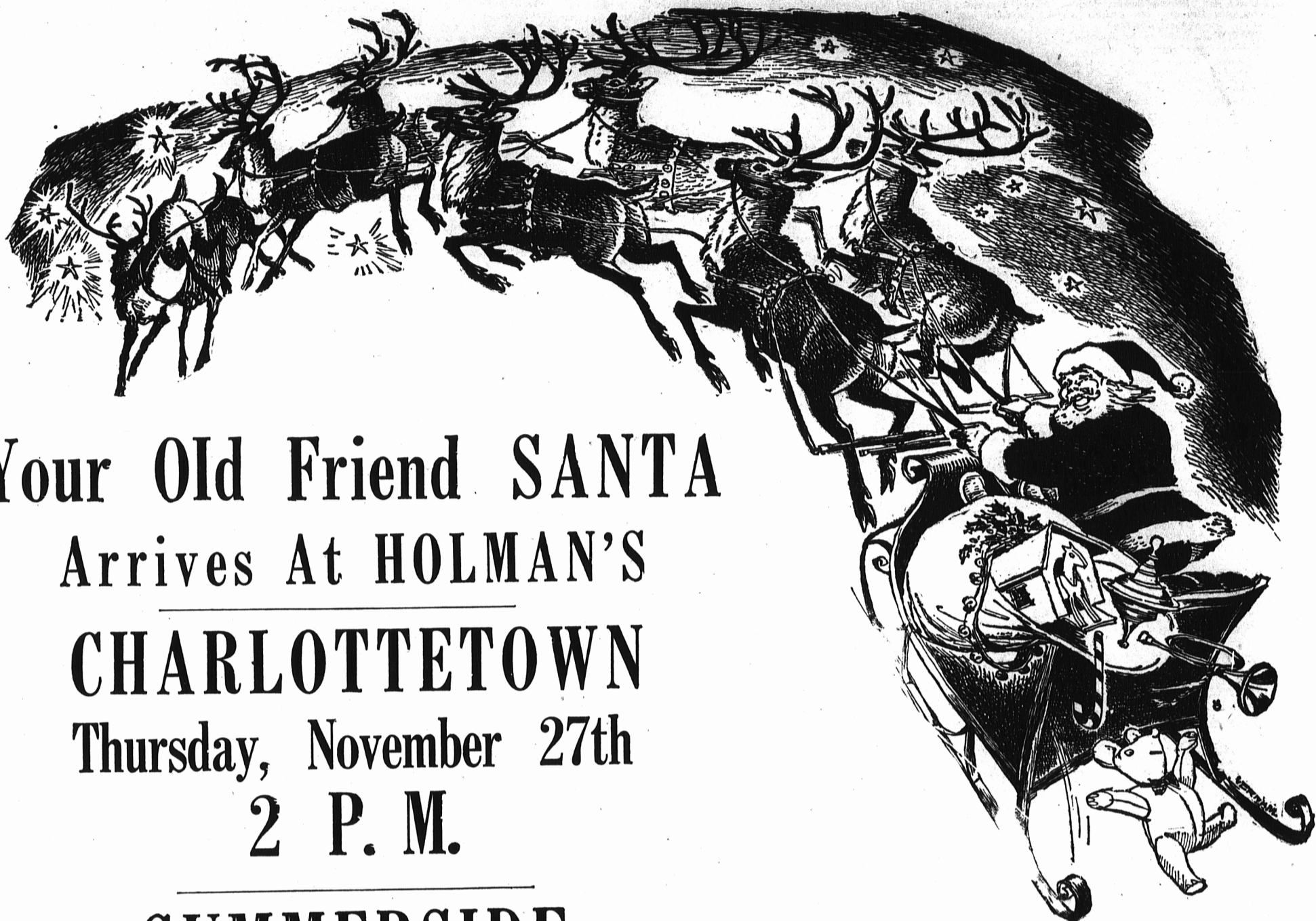
"He can't see," replied the other Mouse. "All Teeny Weeny's eyes are good for is to tell light from darkness. He can't see things of any kind."
