Delicious Jelly Roll

Four eggs, 1 cup sugar, 1 1/2-cup flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 3-4 cup water, 1 teaspoon vanilla. Separate eggs and beat yolks.

Add sugar gradually with water and 1 cup of flour.

Sift baking powder with 1-2 cup flour and fold into batter.

Beat whites of eggs very stiff and fold into batter.

Four evenly into greased baking sheet pan and bake 30 to 35 minutes in moderate oven (350 F).

Remove from pan and invert on moist towel.

Spread with grape or current jelly and roll and allow to set for a few minutes.

After taking towel off, cut in equal lengths and dust with confectionary sugar.
