THE DAIRYMEN'S MEETING.

The dairy industry is of such present and potential interest to the people of this Province, that we make no apology for a somewhat lengthy report of the meeting of the Cheese and Butter Makers' Association. The meeting was one of those in which practical experience, scientific knowledge and good original ideas are rubbed together, and we have no doubt that continued improvement will be the result. The success already achieved by our dairymen warrants a strong hope that Prince Edward Island will lead Canada, as Canada leads the world, in respect to the quality of its cheese, and that in respect to butter, the quality of her output will, ere long, be regarded in the British market as second only to that of Denmark and the Channel Islands. Inspired by this hope, our farmers and dairymen will, we have no doubt, work together and take for their common incentive the motto, "Excellence". The meeting yesterday was fortunate in the presence not only of Mr. Dillon—who is always to be found whenever our dairy interests are being promoted—but also of Mr. Marker, who was trained in Denmark and has studied the treatment of milk from the scientific as well as from the practical point of view. Mr. Marker came here a few weeks ago, and has since been actively engaged in the promotion of winter butter making throughout this Province. He is well pleased with our conditions and prospects, and considers the outlook of dairymen in P. E. Island to be good. His address of yesterday was plain and practical, and in the discussion which followed both he and Mr. Dillon gave our butter and cheese makers several good suggestions to be carried into effect. One of these, relating to the "turnip flavor," ought to be borne in mind and acted upon by those of our farmers who supply milk to the factories.

NEWS NOTES

A movement is on foot in Ottawa for the establishment of a new daily paper, to be the official Liberal organ in the capital. Official figures received at Washington show that fifty thousand Armenian children were made orphans by the Turkish massacres. The city council of Vernon, B. C., proposes shortly to submit by-laws for the establishment of local waterworks and electric lighting services in that city. The British Government has purchased 140,000 bushels of corn in the United States, which will be shipped to India for the relief of sufferers by the famine there. A party of twenty-one Armenians arrived at Halifax by steamer Vancouver last week. They are en route to Toronto, where they are being sent by the Salvation Army. The ratepayers of Cowansville, Que., by 50 to 10, have approved a by-law authorizing the issue of \$20,000 in bonds, to be applied to putting in a system of waterworks. Mayer Herzog, a young New York diamond salesman, has lost \$16,000 worth of uncut diamonds in Boston. He returned to his home in New York with the reward of two thousand dollars for their return. Frank Miles, treasurer of the Boston State Deposit and Trust Co., is under a cloud. A deficit of \$50,000 to \$100,000 has been discovered in the funds of the company. The British admiralty court has awarded the German oil tank steamer Mannheim the sum of £850 for towing the dismantled barge Cypher, of Swansea, into Halifax, September 16th. It is reported that a movement is on foot among the season keepers of Chicago to close their shops for a period of four months, and thereby deprive the city of revenue aggregating \$1,000,000. The credit asked for by the French government to meet the expenses of the transit of the Car and Carriaga to Paris was granted by the Chamber of Deputies on Thursday by a vote of 499 to 21. An invitation has been sent to the government of Canada to be officially represented at the international Scandinavian exhibition to be held at Stockholm from May to October next. The matter is under consideration. At a meeting of the executive committee of the Polish National Alliance, Chicago \$500 was appropriated for the aid of Cuba, and it was decided to collect \$2,000 more for the same purpose among the Polish citizens of Chicago. It is officially announced that there have been 1151 cases of bubonic plague in Bombay, and 1094 deaths from that disease up to date. The exodus from Bombay continues. It is stated that 200,000 persons have fled from the city. Amongst the probable Government measures at the next session of the Dominion Parliament are bills to give the two Controllers Ministerial status, to revise the Franchise Act, to amend the Civil Service Act, and to provide for a plebiscite on prohibition. The national station race to be decided at Morris Park in the spring of 1898, worth \$20,000, has called out nominations from every breeding establishment in the country. Over 35 stallions are registered, and the number will number well into the hundreds. Ellen Sadler, aged 36 years, the wife of a small farmer residing not far from Limerick, I. E., on the 25th of November, while suffering from religious delusions, killed her four children, all girls, by cutting their throats with a razor. The youngest was five months old, the eldest only four years. She explained that what she did was for their good. Grace Episcopal church, Calvary Baptist church, and the First Methodist and Presbyterian churches at L'Anse-au-Loup, Mich., have been sold for non-payment of taxes, and twenty other churches are in danger of a similar sale. Church circles are greatly agitated over the matter, the trustees claiming that they had no notice of the delinquency, as the taxes were for special sewer improvements. The recent Imperial announcement in connection with the army, navy and fortifications in British North America and the West Indian Islands have raised a steady public interest in that direction. It is believed in military circles that a second regiment of infantry will be stationed at Halifax. A number of new fortifications will be built at several points on the Canadian and Atlantic seaboard. It is also stated that the squadron is to be strengthened by fifteen ships exclusive of torpedo boat destroyers.

CHEESE AND BUTTER-MAKERS ASSOCIATION.

Adjourned Annual Meeting.

ADDRESSES BY DILLON AND MARKER.

Mutual Improvement Ending in a Banquet.

The adjourned annual meeting of the Cheese and Butter-Makers' Association of this Province took place, in this city, yesterday afternoon. Messrs. Dillon and Marker, and most of our cheese and butter-makers, were present. The President, Mr. Joseph Burgess, occupied the chair and delivered a short opening address, in which he referred to the success of the past season's business and to a remark of the Minister of Agriculture to the effect that the "little province down by the sea produced a finer quality of cheese in the past season than either Ontario or Quebec." He spoke of the need of steady and mutual improvement on the part of the butter and cheese makers, and concluded by saying that an association such as this is necessary to the continued success of the Province in respect to dairymen.

MR. DILLON'S ADDRESS.

Mr. T. J. Dillon, Dairy Superintendent for the Province, then addressed the association, complimenting the makers on the very successful season just closed and the great improvement made. Our cheese was never before so good or so uniform in respect to flavor. But there is still a great work before the association. It is one thing to reach the top and another thing to stay there. To maintain our position, each maker must have the hearty co-operation of his patrons. We have reached a point at which a majority of the patrons supply good milk and our duty now is to see that the quality of the milk to this end must be exercised by the makers and the necessity of supplying good pure milk constantly insisted upon.

MR. MARKER'S ADDRESS.

Mr. Marker began by remarking that the butter and cheesemaker in a factory occupies a position of responsibility and trust. As manager, it is his duty to be strictly economical. The leakage in a factory are many. Steam valves, cream separators, skim milk, churns, buttermilk, cream vats, cream, etc., all require his careful attention. He is in a position to give the patrons of his factory good advice, to answer the "why's" and "wherefore's" of things pertaining to the business, and to show a good example. This is an age of progress, and to keep up with the age, the butter or cheesemaker must obtain and study the dairy papers and the best literature that can be obtained about butter and cheese making. We have greater advantages than those who have gone before us, and we ought to profit by them. The secret of keeping one's "post-d" is comparatively small. A butter or cheese maker should read up his subject and remember what he reads. He should be familiar with the nature of milk and the difficulties which attend its production. From this it follows that he should be a judge of milk and its products. How can he become a judge? Only by reading, observation and practice? He cannot, for instance, ripen cream properly unless he knows the flavor which gives him the right quality of butter. To this end it is necessary to be sure of the quality of the "fermentation starter."

A small band of men, carrying the Republican flag, assembled yesterday at Novelda, in the province of Alicante. When called on to disperse by the gendarmes they refused. Again they were ordered to disperse. Upon a second refusal the gendarmes fired on them, killing seven.
