ADDRESS TO MR. J. H. HASLAM.

The party of Prince Edward Islanders which Mr. J. H. Haslam of the C. P. R. conducted through Manitoba and the Northwest Territories recently, presented that gentleman with an address, of which the following is a copy:

Mr. J. H. Haslam, special agent C. P. R., in charge of excursion from P. E. Island to Edmonton.
