In both groups, the teams get two points for a win, and one point for a tie.

Georgetown is aiming for an Island championship in the Juvenile age group. This team, coached by John Walsh, have been playing together since they were Bantams and have come up with quite a record. They twice won the Bantam and Mid-level championship, and last year, lost out in the Juvenile finals by only one goal. 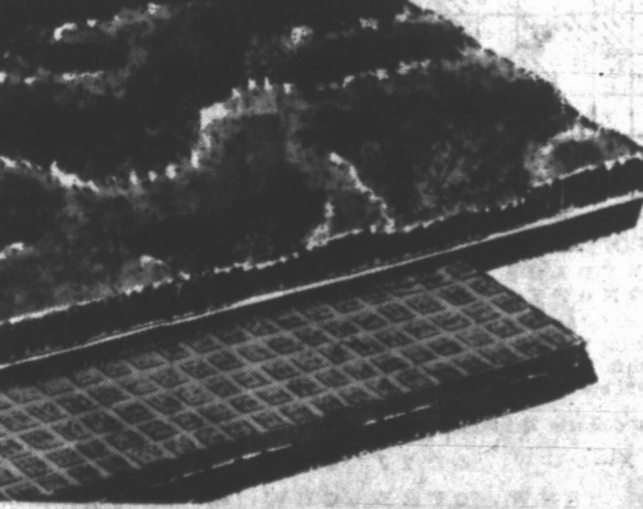
