Island Governor Receives Message

His Honor, Lieutenant-Governor the Honourable W.J. MacDonnell, E.D., Lieutenant-Governor of the province of Prince Edward Island, has received the following message from The Right Honourable Viscount Amery, chairman of the Joint Commonwealth Societies Council.

The message is from Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II on the occasion of Commonwealth Day, June 11, which is also Her Majesty's official birthday in the United Kingdom.

Last year in my first Commonwealth Day message I asked that we should seek every opportunity to get to know one another better.

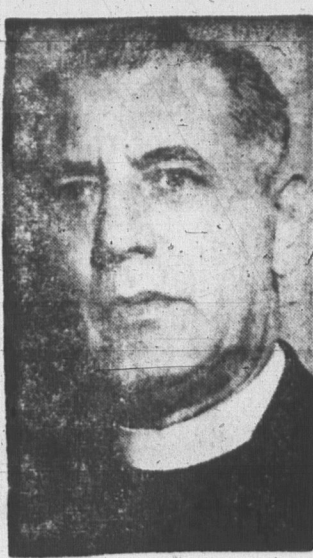
"I am sure that this is the best way to avoid false impressions and misunderstandings. When you know people well, you are unlikely to misunderstand them. Misunderstandings are surely the besetting danger of the world in which we live."

"In the Commonwealth we

have a group of nations amounting to a fifth of the world's people. Each nation belongs to this group through its own choice. It chooses to belong, because it sees in the Commonwealth a great co-operative effort for peaceful development, to which it wishes to contribute and from which it hopes to benefit. Because our association is voluntary and spontaneous, we all rejoice when we can find common ground and we are distressed when differences arise.

"When we look back into history of great causes that have triumphed, we always find one common factor. Each has passed through periods of test, when doubt, fear and conflicting interests have threatened to bring its progress to a stop and then, because those with clear eyes and stout hearts held fast to their vision, it survived, grew in intensity in men's hearts and flourished."

Cattle Sale Is Discussed

The advisability of holding a province-wide sale of feeder cattle next autumn, and the shipment of additional cattle to Toronto when cattle start moving again, were discussed here last night at a meeting of the directors of the P.E.I. Beef Producers' Association.

The association sponsored shipments of several carloads of beef cattle to Toronto several months ago, and the move stepped up prices offered here several directors said last night.

The price paid for beef cattle here is "satisfactory" one director said. It equals what a farmer could get by shipping to Toronto, minus the transportation costs involved, he added.

Also discussed last night was the possibility of holding weekly sales of cattle in the province, similar to what is done regularly now at such Maritime points as Sussex and Truro.

The idea of holding a beef field day was also discussed. The suggestion was that it might

be held in the autumn. Field days for the summer are already planned by the Angus, Hereford and Shorthorn Associations, it was explained. Eddie Clark, Lot 6 was named as the association's representative on a Maritime committee to discuss and lay plans for a beef testing program on the sire and progeny level.

Acies Ceremony Held Recently

The Acies Ceremony of the P.E.I. Curia of the Legion of Mary was held recently at the Notre Dame-Convent Chapel in Charlottetown.

Held once a year the Acies Ceremony is the occasion when members, both auxiliary and active, consecrate themselves anew to the service of the Mother of God.

The ceremony was under the direction of Rev. W. Comerford, C.S.S.R., assistant spiritual director of the Prince Edward Island Curia of The Legion of Mary.

The special speaker for the evening was Rev. Walter Reid.

He spoke to the members on the great need for the practise of Christian charity in the world today. He pointed out to the members how this could be done through their works as members of the Legion of Mary apostolate. Sister Mary Honora, CND, was accompanist for the hymns which were sung during the evening.

Vanier, Hellyer Praise Program

The 35 Legion of Mary members in attendance were from Holy Redeemer Parish and St. Dunstan's Basilica parish, Charlottetown, St. Paul's parish, Summerside, and St. James parish, Georgetown, and Junior members from Holy Redeemer parish, Charlottetown.

The armed forces integration program has accelerated in the past year at a pace that is "highly encouraging", said Defence Minister Paul Hellyer in an Armed Forces Day message released yesterday.

He said it was an indication

of the professional calibre of the country's defence forces that "these major changes have taken place without in any way lowering our operational efficiency or readiness." On the contrary, "Canada's regular forces had shown their flexibility and efficiency through such major commitments as the United Nations, the Zambian airlift, Exercise Wintered Express in Norway, assistance to the province of Manitoba during its flood crisis, and others."

Reserve forces, he said, have vigorously attacked their reorganization program, have surmounted many difficulties, and are "well on the way to the objective of producing a well-organized, vigorously led, mission-oriented reserve."

In another Armed Forces Day message, Governor General Georges Vanier praised "the splendid record and the continuing dedication of our men and women in uniform."

The Governor General said the armed forces represent the best traditions of our country: the spirit of service and self-discipline, and "the concentra-

tion of intellect and energy to a cause, greater than the individual—the cause of our freedom and the world's peace."
