aid policies. These changes included getting part-time students into the program, a raise in the per-week loan allowance, and lengthening the period of grace after graduation before students must start to repay loans.

Not everyone is as enthusiastic as Dowdell. Last spring, the University of Toronto, St. Mary's University and the University of Victoria held referenda in which students rejected CFS. For the last two years, CFS has been severely criticized by SUNS, the Student Unions of Nova Scotia. SUNS maintains that the organization over-represents the interests of Central and Western Canadian students at the expense of Eastern universities and colleges. It says that CFS programs such as STUDENTSAVER are notably sparser in the Atlantic provinces, compared to their Ontario counterparts. Another objection is the lack of a full-time chair, elected

by the CFS membership. At present, there is no elected representative on the CFS staff.

A common criticism is that CFS went into debt in its first year of operation and, although its budget is only \$400,000, still has a deficit of \$47,000. Dowdell attributes the problems to bad management. He says that a financial co-ordinator for CFS has been hired and that "this year's budget is the strictest yet. We plan to eliminate the deficit."

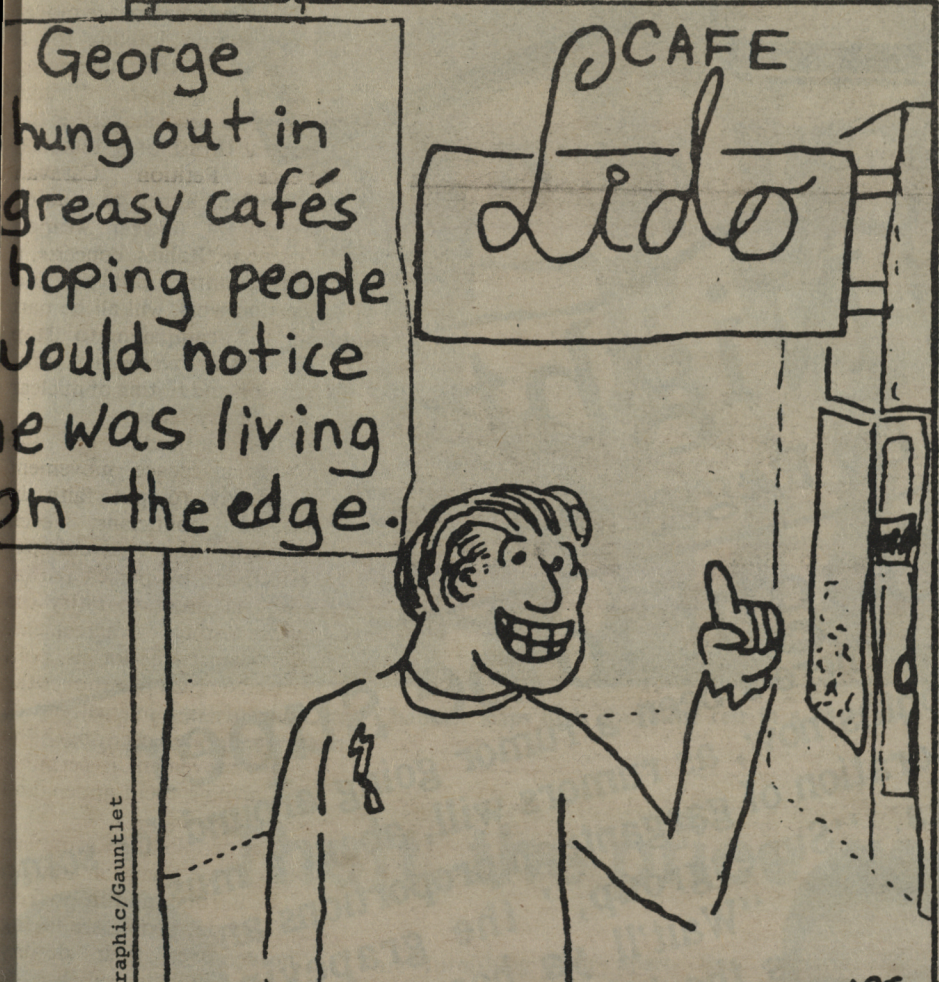
