INTERRUPTION NOTICE

EASTERN KINGS COUNTY

There will be an interruption of electric power in Eastern Kings County on Wednesday afternoon and early Thursday morning, weather permitting.

This interruption is necessary to permit us to relocate our transmission and distribution lines as required by road construction work on the Seven Mile Road.
