Universal Calendar Discussed By Church

VATICAN CITY (AP)—Steps to bring the Roman Catholic Church on record as agreeable to a universal or perpetual calendar were taken at the ecumenical council here. Several bishops in St. Peter's Basilica urged study of both a fixed Easter date and the idea of a year-round calendar. A council adviser who sat in on the day's closing liturgy (public worship) explained: "What the church could do—and the council—is to say that there is no religious objection to a calendar that is willing to go along with civil authorities. . . . You could hardly expect the church nowadays to act unilaterally in trying to effect such a change. . . . As for Easter, much of the church (liturgical) year depends on when it comes. The church year could make much more sense if it were somewhat more regulated."

Famous Que. Strongman Died Half-Century Ago

MONTRÉAL (CP) — Half a century ago Saturday a man who was talked about as "the strongest man who ever lived" died in his Montreal home. He was Louis Cyr, whose prodigious feats of strength brought him acclaim in Europe and North America. Louis Cyr was born Oct. 10, 1826, in Napierville. He died Nov. 10, 1912, at the age of 86. As a lad he took a delight in lifting heavy objects — stones, iron bars, lengths of railroad tracks. He was 19 when he took death, special observances are to be carried out today at St. Pierre Apôté Church, Dorchester and Visitation Streets, in the parish where he lived; at the church in Napierville, where he was buried. . . . He was never tried to sell his strength. . . . He won the Canadian championship from David Michael of Québec and went on to defeat world-renowned strong men. . . . He could never get the great Eugene Sandow to meet him, although he flung challenge after challenge, backed by money. . . . In his prime Cyr could lift 553 pounds with one finger. With his one hand he could lift 987 pounds and with two hands 1,887 pounds. He could push up

650 pounds on his shoulder, and he could carry 4,300 pounds on his back. . . . Cyr was only five feet, 10 1/2 inches tall. But he was massive in build and weighed 300 pounds. At his peak, his chest was 60 inches and his waist 45 inches. His neck was 22 inches around, his biceps 23 inches, his forearm 19 inches, his thigh 30 inches and his calf 28 inches. His mother was a big woman. She weighed 200 pounds and was six feet, one inch tall. His father was tall and strong but not particularly heavy. . . . In his early days of competition Cyr wore his hair extremely long. He would let men hang on to it while he wrestled himself — and them about. He frequently wore a moustache and a small goatee. . . . He heard. He would let no one cut his hair but his wife. . . . From the early 1860s Cyr
