

Air Force Appointments Announced

OTTAWA (CP)—Three senior air force officers will receive new appointments in July and another will retire, the defence department has announced.

Group Capt. G. C. Richards, 41, of Toronto, director of automation at Canadian forces headquarters, Ottawa, goes to allied air forces headquarters at Fontainebleau, France, as assistant chief of staff, communications and electronics.

He will succeed Group Capt. H. M. Fitzgerald, 46, of Halifax, who becomes senior training officer at training command headquarters, Winnipeg.

Group Capt. A. H. Liff, 49, of Ottawa and Winnipeg, will become commanding officer of No. 1 Supply Depot, Downsview, Ont., succeeding Group Capt. G. C. McCormick, 52, of Vankleek Hill, Ont., who is retiring.

Mexican Rail Deal Okayed

OTTAWA (CP)—A formal agreement was signed here to permit the sale of \$100,000,000 worth of steel rails by Dominion Steel and Coal Corporation to Mexican National Railways.

The sale was announced three weeks ago by Labor Minister MacEachen, who witnessed the signing in the office of Trade Minister Sharp. The agreement authorizes the Export Credits Insurance Corporation to provide financing to cover the sale.

Shipments from Desco's Sydney plant are expected to start in July and be completed by the end of this year. Mr. MacEachen said the sale would directly ensure six to seven months of employment for 1,100 men in Desco's rolling mills and Cape Breton coal mines.

Tuesday's agreement was signed by T. H. McEvoy, vice-president of Desco, H. T. Altman, president of Export Credits, and Thomas Chase-Casrain, secretary of Export Credits. It was witnessed by Mr. Sharp, Mr. MacEachen and Rafael Urdaneta, Mexican ambassador to Canada.

The sale brings to \$55,000,000 the value of steel rails and accessories sold to Mexico by Desco in the last five years.
