STOCK BREEDERS' ASSOCIATION.

ARRANGEMENTS are being made by the Maritime Stock Breeders' Association for a number of meetings in Charlottetown and throughout the Province on behalf of mutual co-operation in raising the standard of stock breeding in this Province. The meetings in Charlottetown will be held on the 28th and 29th inst., and will be addressed by eminent practical stock breeders from Ontario, and there will be a farmers dinner in the evening of the 27th. At a meeting in the Hotel Davies yesterday afternoon the following gentlemen were appointed a committee to make arrangements viz., Judge Warburton, (President); F. L. Haszard, J. H. Beer, J. J. Davies, D. O'M. Reddin, Senator Ferguson, George Carter and C. R. Smallwood, (Secretary).
