## THE CUBAN JUNTA'S DENIAL.

### What the New York Members Say.

#### ARE GRATEFUL TO THE UNITED STATES

For Their Intervention—Annexation Manifesto Issued.

NEW YORK, Sept 16.—H. S. Rubens, counsel of the Cuban Junta here, to-day denied the statement that the visit to Cuba of Benjamin Guerra, of the New York Junta, was for the purpose of harmonizing Cuban factional differences and presenting a united front against any attempt at American annexation.

Mr. Rubens said that there was nothing to show that the government was not as sincere now in its promise to secure Cuban independence as at the time it sent its ultimatum to Spain. Mr. Guerra, no more than any other Cuban leader, never had any idea that there was any danger of American annexation. There is no feeling in Cuba or among the Cubans, but one of gratitude to the American government for intervention.

"The Cuban people are not responsible for opinions or actions of any individual or small group of individuals, who may disagree with the majority.

"A manifesto said to be issued by autonomists deprecates annexation, or any American protectorate or anything less than complete independence of the island, and advocates the establishment of cordial relations between the Spanish and Cubans, does not reflect the attitude of the Separatists."

## SULTAN HAS TO CLIMB DOWN.

### The British Government Stands No Nonsense.

#### TURKEY PUNISHED FOR HER INSULT TO ENGLAND.

British Troops Now in Command—Turks Have to Disarm.

CANDIA, Crete, Sept. 19.—The Sultan has ordered Djavad Pasha, the military Commander in Crete, to accede to the demands of the British admiral for disarmament, thus complying with the whole ultimatum of the British admiral.

The British military detachment occupies the entrance to the forts and it is rumored that the Ottoman troops will be withdrawn and a British force will occupy the town.

#### RUN DOWN IN FOG.

Schooner Electa of Bangor Dis-masted

BOSTON, Sept 19.—The three masted schooner Electa Bailey of Bangor from Port Liberty, N. Y., to Portsmouth with coal, while rounding Cape Cod in a thick fog early on Saturday evening was run down and completely dismasted by the steamer Parthian, bound from this port to Philadelphia.

None of the crew of the schooner were injured except the captain who received a slight bruise.

As the vessel was making no water the Parthian took her in tow dropping her off at Boston.

## GREETED WITH HISSES AND ABUSE

### General Toral Insulted by the People

#### FOR SURRENDERING SANTIAGO TO THE AMERICANS.

An Epistle Which Will Probably Mean a Duel.

MADRID, Sept. 16.—General Toral, who surrendered the Spanish army at Santiago to the Americans, arrived at Vigo from Santiago today. A great crowd awaited his arrival on the pier and greeted the general with a storm of hisses and abuse. The demonstration was so violent that General Toral returned to the ship, deciding not to land at Vigo.

El Liberal says that General Linarez, the former governor of the province of Santiago de Cuba, has wired Count De Almenas as follows: "The responsibility for our misfortunes is directly traceable to persons like you, bearing titles and holding seats in the chamber for their own benefit who imagine that they can with impunity injure those who suffered silently and even attempt to divert their rewards. I, who honorably fought reply to your accusations with disdain."

This can mean nothing less than a duel between the two men.

#### English Cricketers Win.

#### They Were Poisoned.

SEOUL, COREA, September 16.—It is reported here that a high official of the palace has made a confession that he ordered the cook of the royal household to poison food intended for the king and the crown prince both of whom became seriously ill on last Sunday. The official further confessed that the poisoning plot was instigated by a former interpreter attached to the Russian legation here, who was once a court favorite, but is now in disgrace.

#### United Ireland Suspended.

DUBLIN, Sept 17.—United Ireland, which was established by the late Charles Stewart Parnell in 1881, as the organ of the Land League has ceased publication. Lately it has been the organ of the re-union of the Nationalist party.

#### A Dry Plebiscite Day.

OTTAWA, Sept 16.—The Secretary of State said today. "There can be no question that no liquor must be sold or given away on plebiscite day, under penalty of \$100 fine or imprisonment. Further, by the 73rd and succeeding sections of the Dominion Elections Act it is provided that returning officers and deputy returning officers are vested with full powers of justice of peace, to attend to the enforcement of the law. The sixth section of the plebiscite act enacts that the Dominion Elections Act shall apply to the conduct of all proceedings, in submitting the prohibition question to the electors.

#### The French Must Leave.

LONDON, Sept 17.—A despatch to the Morning Post from Cairo says that General Kitchener has absolute authority to claim Fashoda as Egyptian territory and to expel the present occupants forcibly if necessary. Fashoda, the correspondent says, will then be occupied by an Egyptian garrison.

The Daily Telegraph's Cairo correspondent telegraphs that General Kitchener intends to present an ultimatum demanding that the French expedition under Major Marchand quit Fashoda forthwith.

#### News From Ottawa.

#### The Spanish Peace Commission.

MADRID, Sept 17.—It is reported here that the Spanish peace commission will be composed of Senor Montero Rios, president of the senate, Senor Villarrutia, General Cerero, General Azcarraga and Senor Urzaiz. But further changes are possible.
