

Macmillan Pays Tribute To Kennedy

LONDON (CP)—Harold Macmillan paid tribute to John F. Kennedy as a man that the whole world, even the Russians, trusted "to hold in his hand the thunderbolt of nuclear power."

The former prime minister, still recovering from an operation that prompted his recent resignation, spoke in the Commons Monday as it honored the slain U.S. president.

Two other former prime ministers also lauded Kennedy.

Earl Attlee, former Labor prime minister, spoke in the House of Lords of Kennedy's death as the world's loss. The Earl of Avon (formerly Sir Anthony Eden, who resigned after the 1956 Suez crisis) praised the late president's ability to deal with crises.

"He showed a firmness tinged with moderation and was able, without weakness, to encourage tensions between nations to remain in the open."

Both houses of Parliament formally passed a motion asking the Queen to "express to the President of the United States of America the shock and deep sorrow with which this House has learned of the death of President Kennedy."

Gov't Outlines Special Plans For '67 Tourists

OTTAWA (CP)—Trade Minister Mitchell Sharp said here the federal government plans to double its tourist promotion effort to attract a record number of visitors to Canada during the 1967 centennial year.

He told the annual meeting of the federal-provincial tourist conference that the objective of the stepped-up drive for foreign tourists will be \$1,000,000 in travel income.

This would compare with an estimated \$600,000,000 in spending by foreign tourists this year, up \$40,000,000 from 1962 and \$18,000,000 from 1961.

Mr. Sharp said that if Canada is to reap a rich tourist harvest on its 100th birthday there must be an intensified campaign in the next three years to sell Canada to foreigners.

"Time is short but there still is enough time to prepare," he told more than 100 delegates attending the convention. They include delegates from federal, provincial and transportation companies and agencies interested in promoting Canada's tourist business.

Moratorium On Speeches Is Planned

WASHINGTON (CP-AP)—Leading Republicans indicated Monday that there will be a moratorium on political speeches and campaigns for at least the next 30 days.

Governor Rockefeller of New York said he would not campaign for the Republican presidential nomination during the 30-day period of mourning for President Kennedy which he has decreed for New York State.

And Republican Senators Barry Goldwater of Arizona and Hugh Scott of Pennsylvania proposed a moratorium until Jan. 1 on political speeches.
