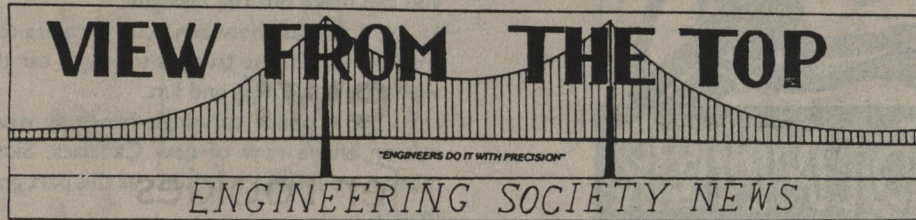


# NOTICES

## Residence bursary- Bernardine Hall (\$500)

FOLLOWING ARE THE TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE ABOVE-NAMED BURSARY:

1. Recipient must be a Junior or Senior student living in Bernardine Hall who has lived there for at least two years.

2. Must have an average of 65% or better in last semester's work and passing grade in all five subjects.

3. Must write a personal essay about what she/he has participated in during her/his years in residence. How has she/he promoted spirit in Bernardine Hall?

4. Selection to be made by a committee from the Department of Student Services (composed of the Residence Manager or Co-ordinator of Residence Program, Director of Student Services, and one counsellor) with final approval given by the Scholarship and Bursary Committee.

5. Selection to be made in conjunction with other bursaries awarded from the Memorial Bursary Fund.

Application forms are available at the Registrar's Office or at Student Services. Closing date for applications is FRIDAY, 11 FEBRUARY 1994.

4. Must be working towards a first degree as opposed to upgrading for a second degree.
